Partnering with local school districts and backbone organizations such as E3 Alliance, the Challenge provided students with incentives and fun, educational activities that engaged students while providing college planning information and promoting a peer culture that supports attendance improvement and academic success.

High absenteeism has been a challenge in Central Texas. Each year, Central Texas students are absent 2.4 million days of school and miss more days of school than their peers across the state in every grade. Each day our students miss costs our schools

about \$38 in lost state revenue. Across Central Texas, our schools have been losing more than \$91 million a year! That's why E3 Alliance spear-headed a regional campaign to improve attendance starting in 2011. Since the start of the campaign, Central Texas schools have saved more than \$12M in increased revenue due to improve attendance.
