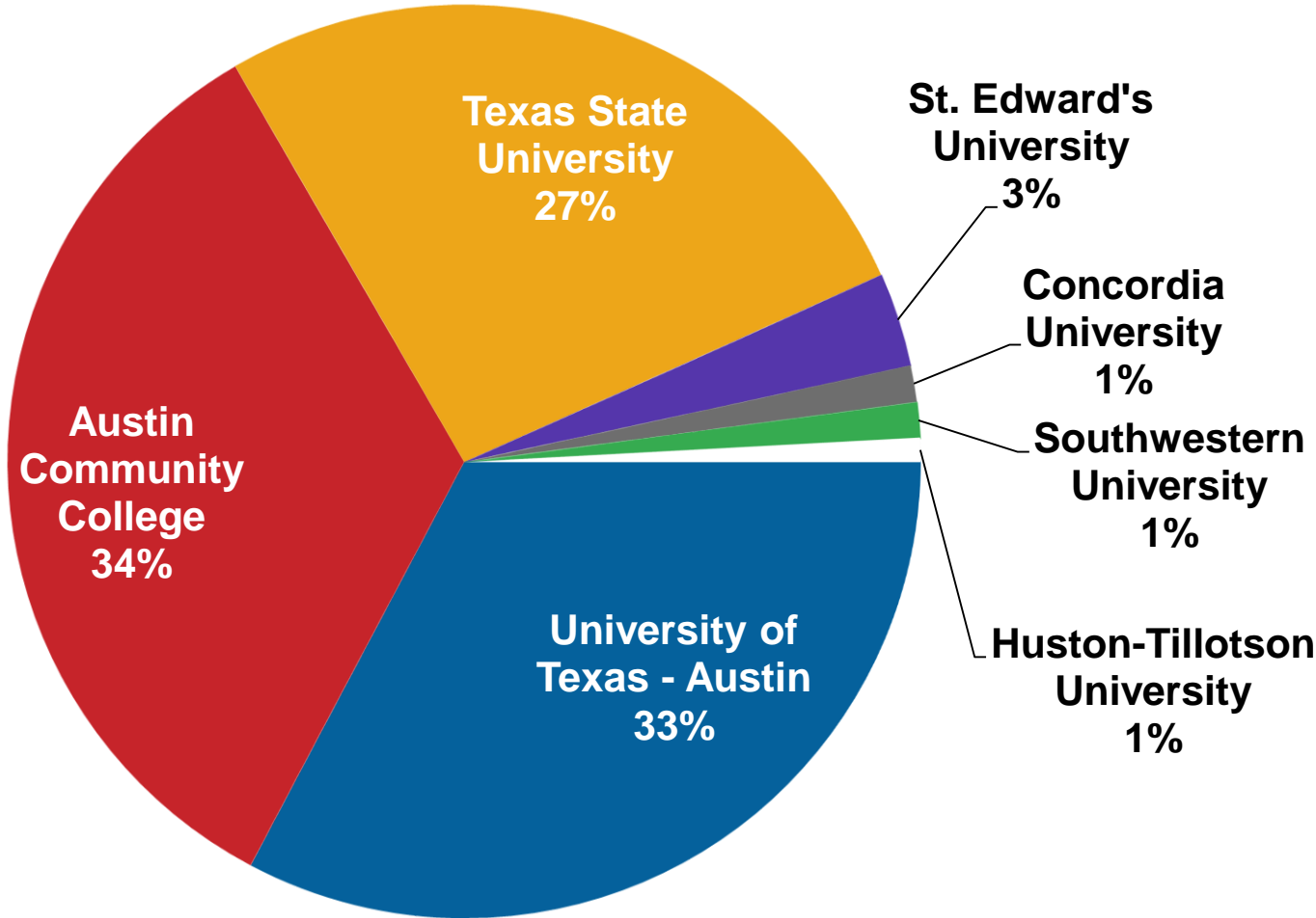

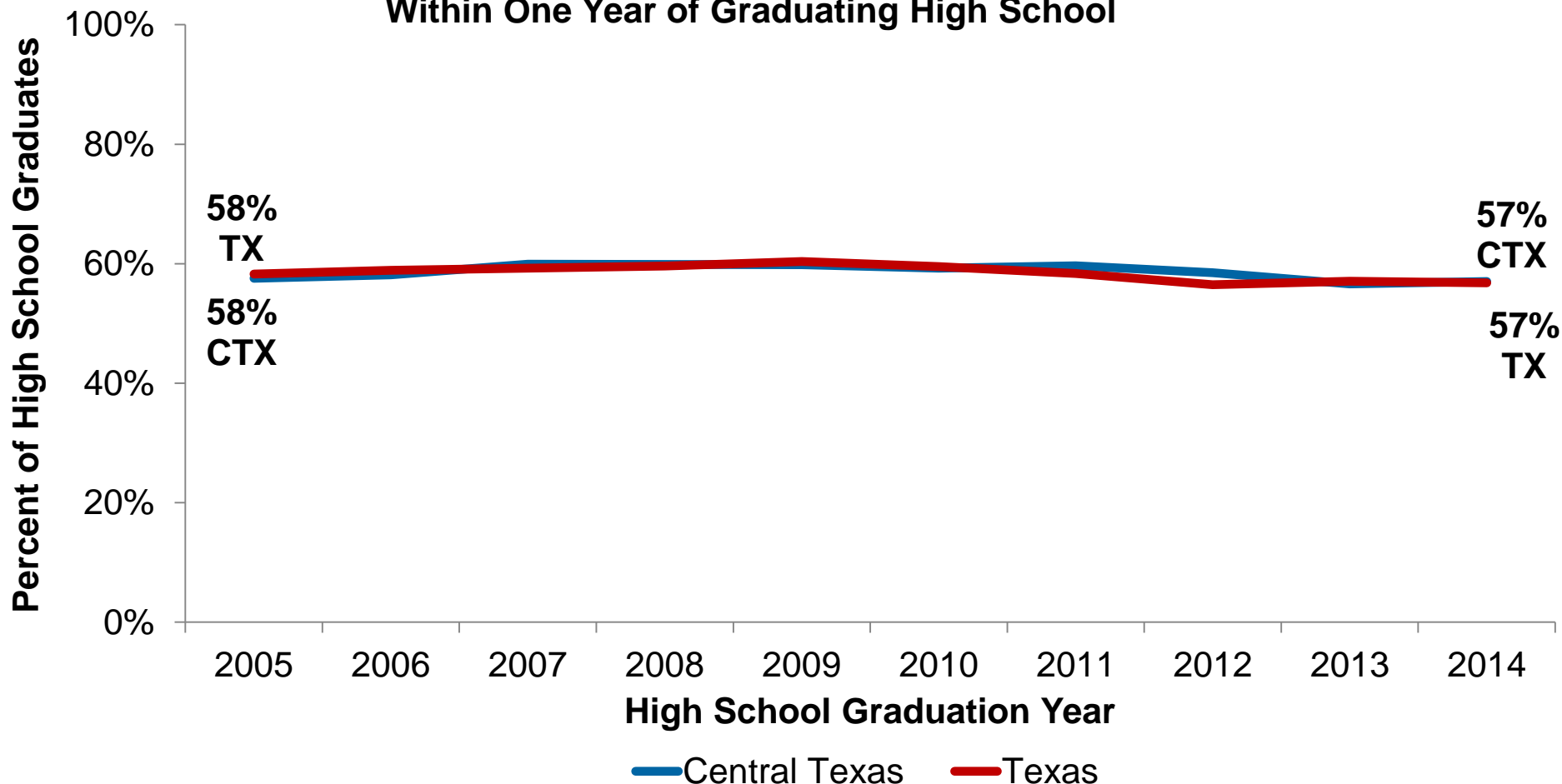

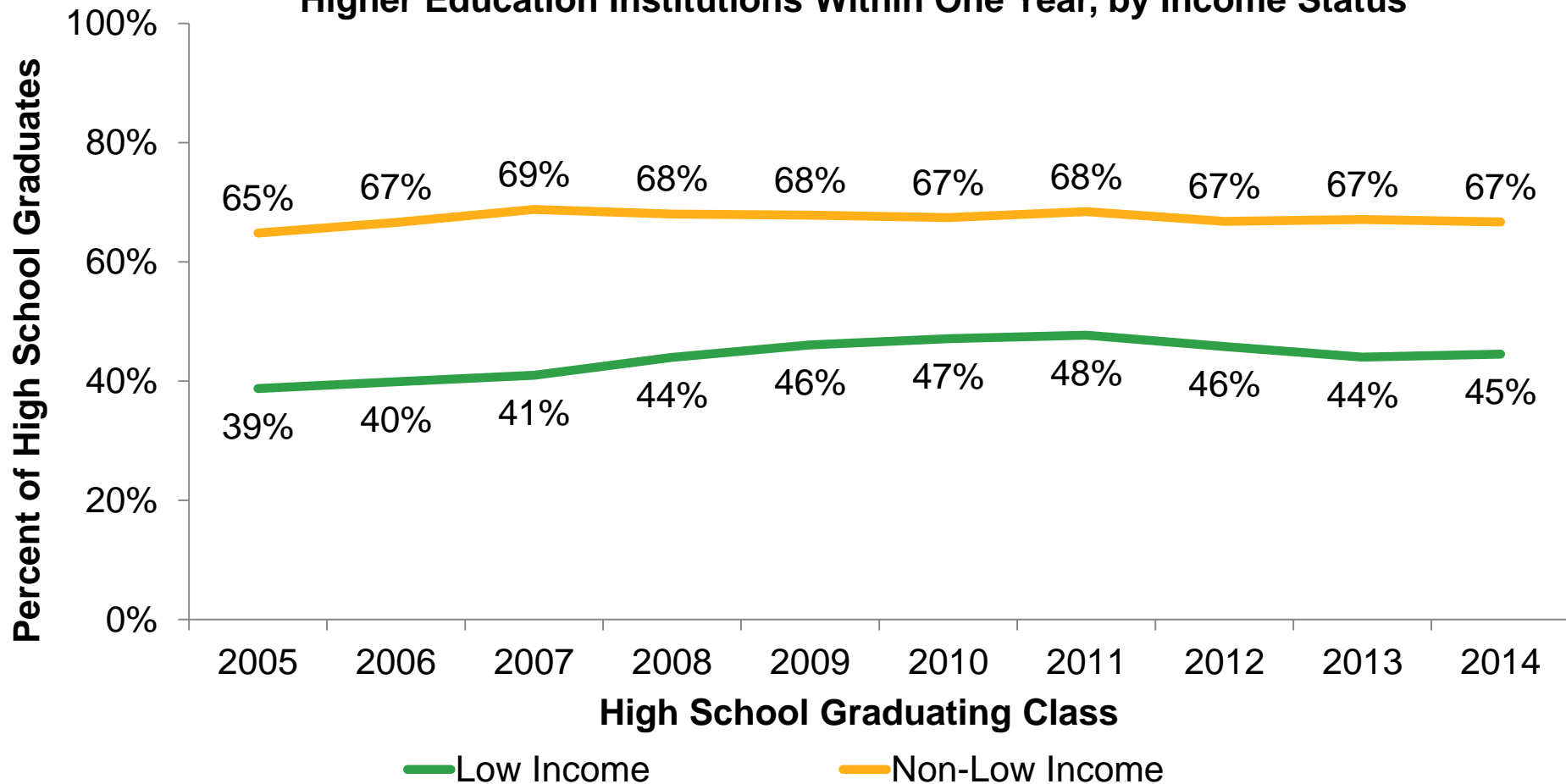
No Improvement in Proportion of High School Graduates Enrolling in Texas Higher Ed Institutions

Within One Year of Graduating High School**

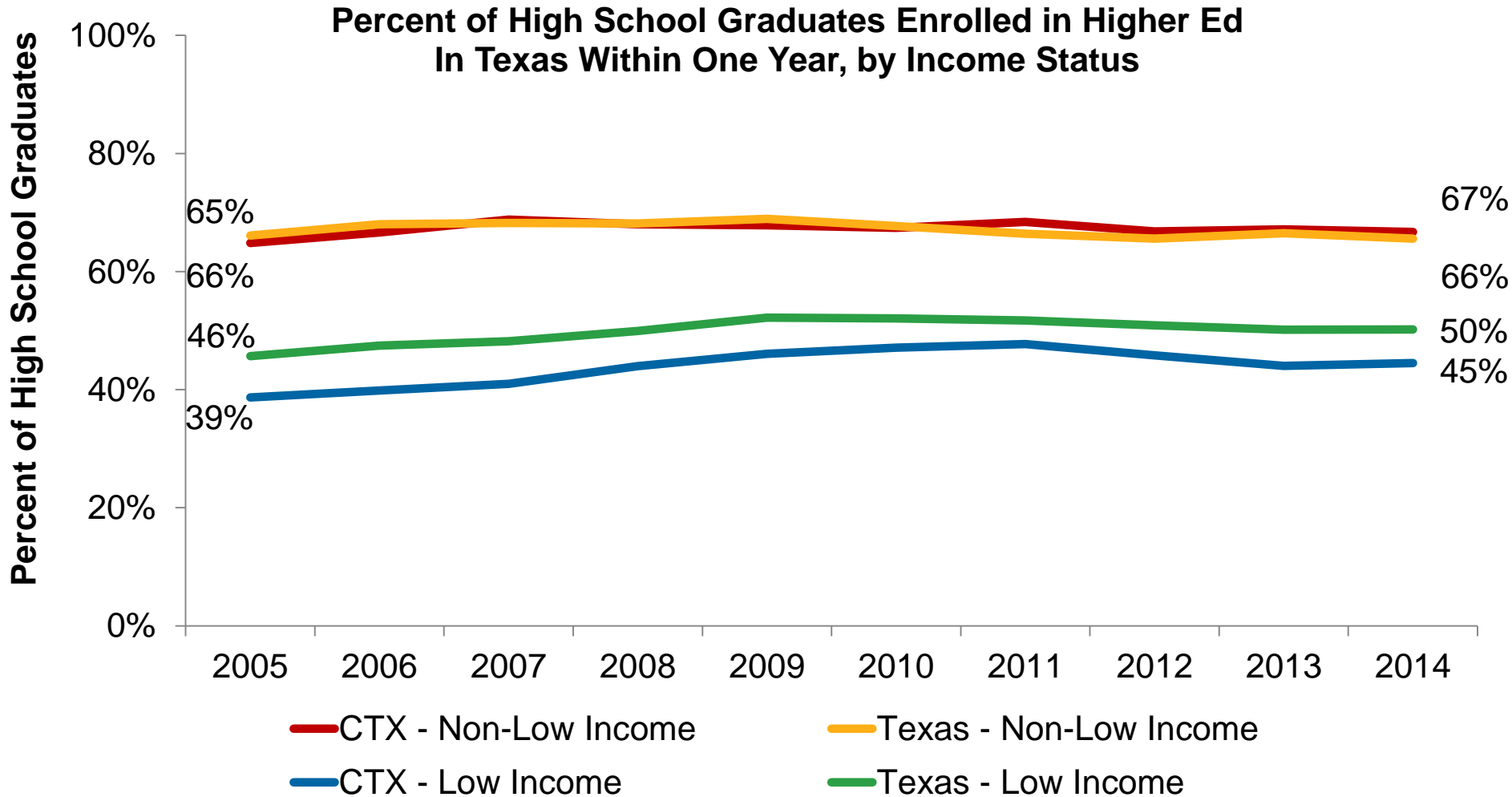


Enrollment Rates for Low Income High School Grads Increased Through 2011, Then Declined

Percent of Central Texas High School Graduates Enrolled in Texas Higher Education Institutions Within One Year, by Income Status

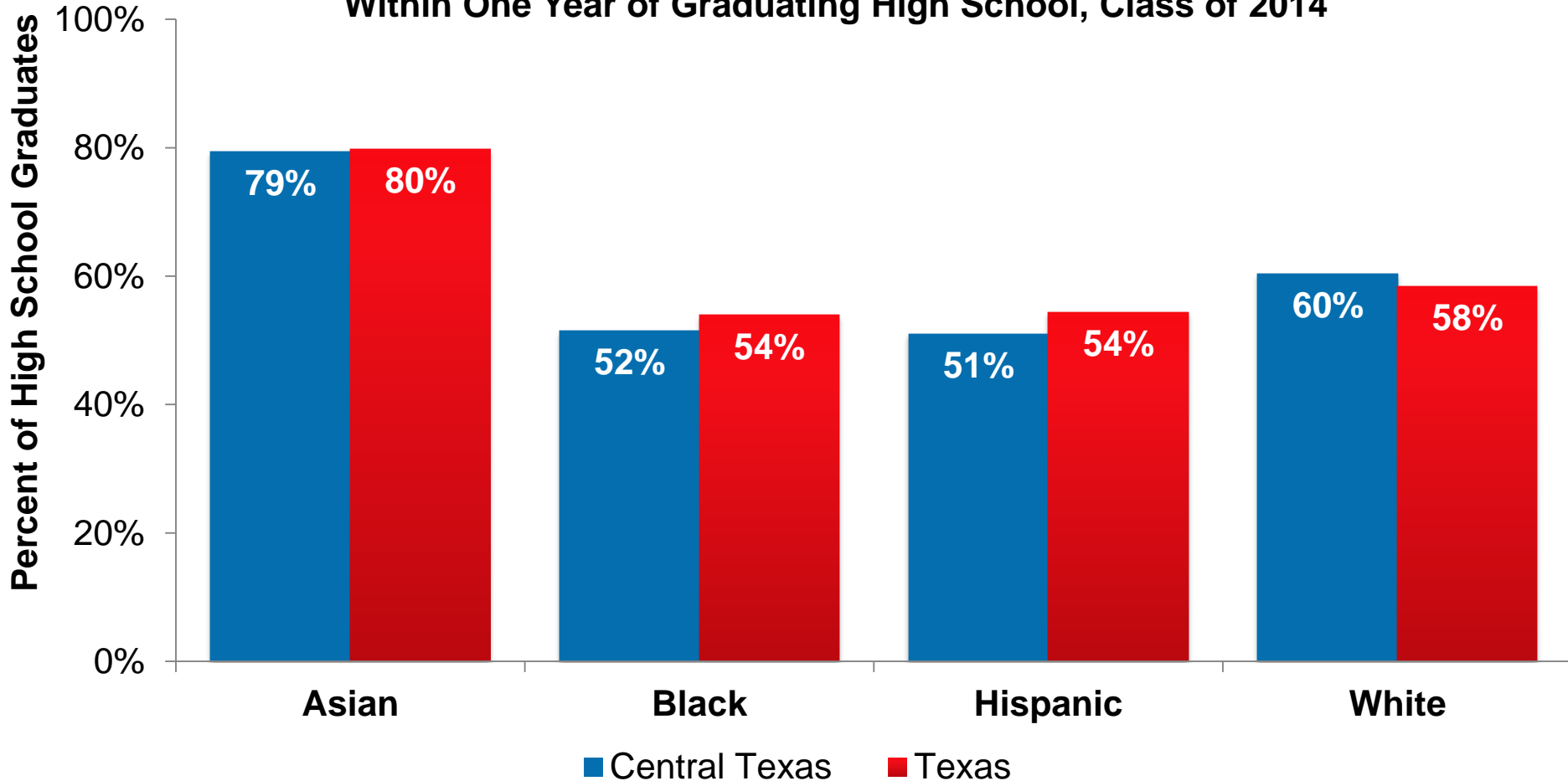


Higher Education Enrollment for Central Texas Low Income Students Lags Behind Texas

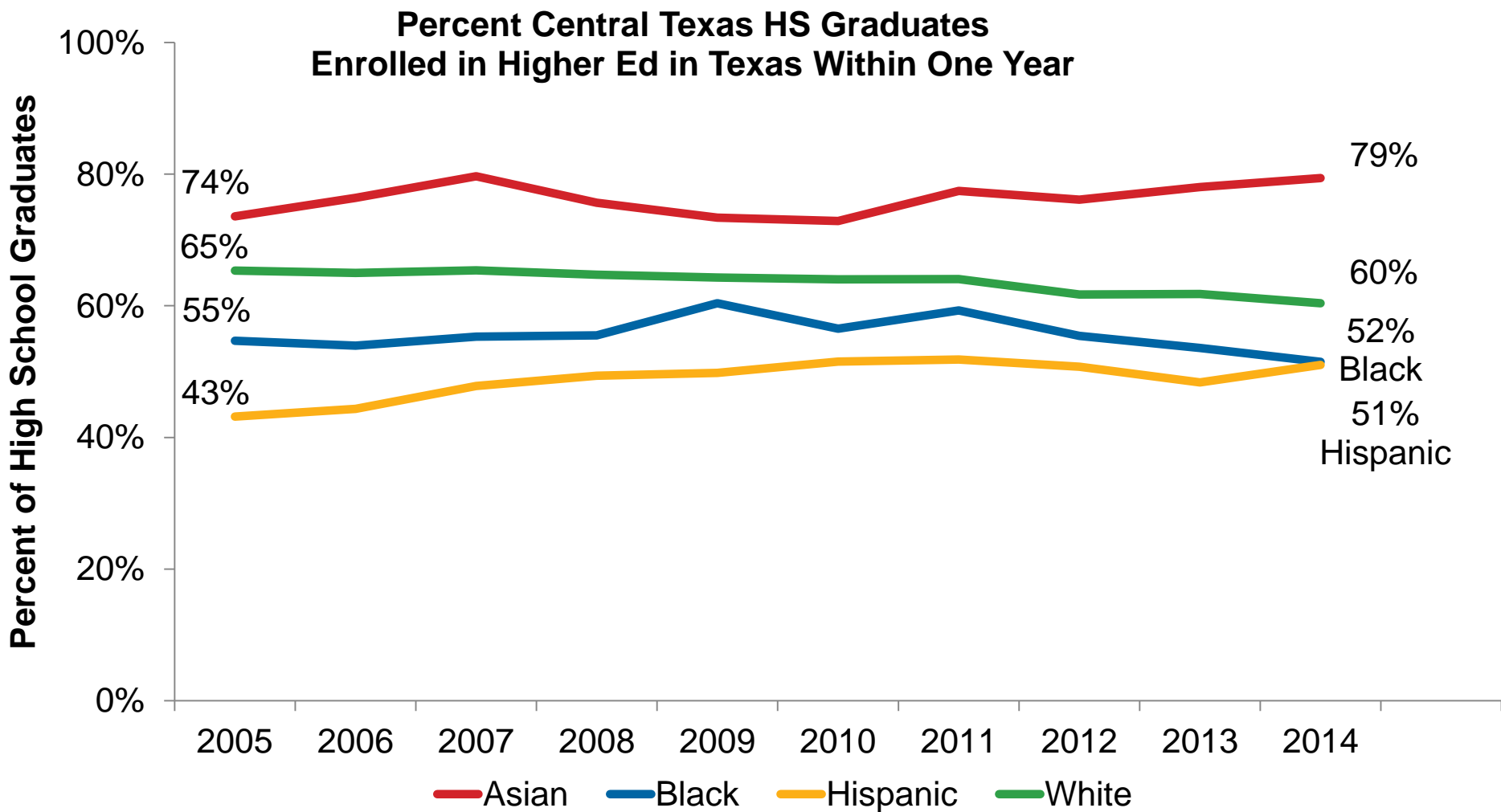


Higher Education Enrollment Rates by Ethnicity Relatively Consistent in Central Texas and Texas

Within One Year of Graduating High School, Class of 2014

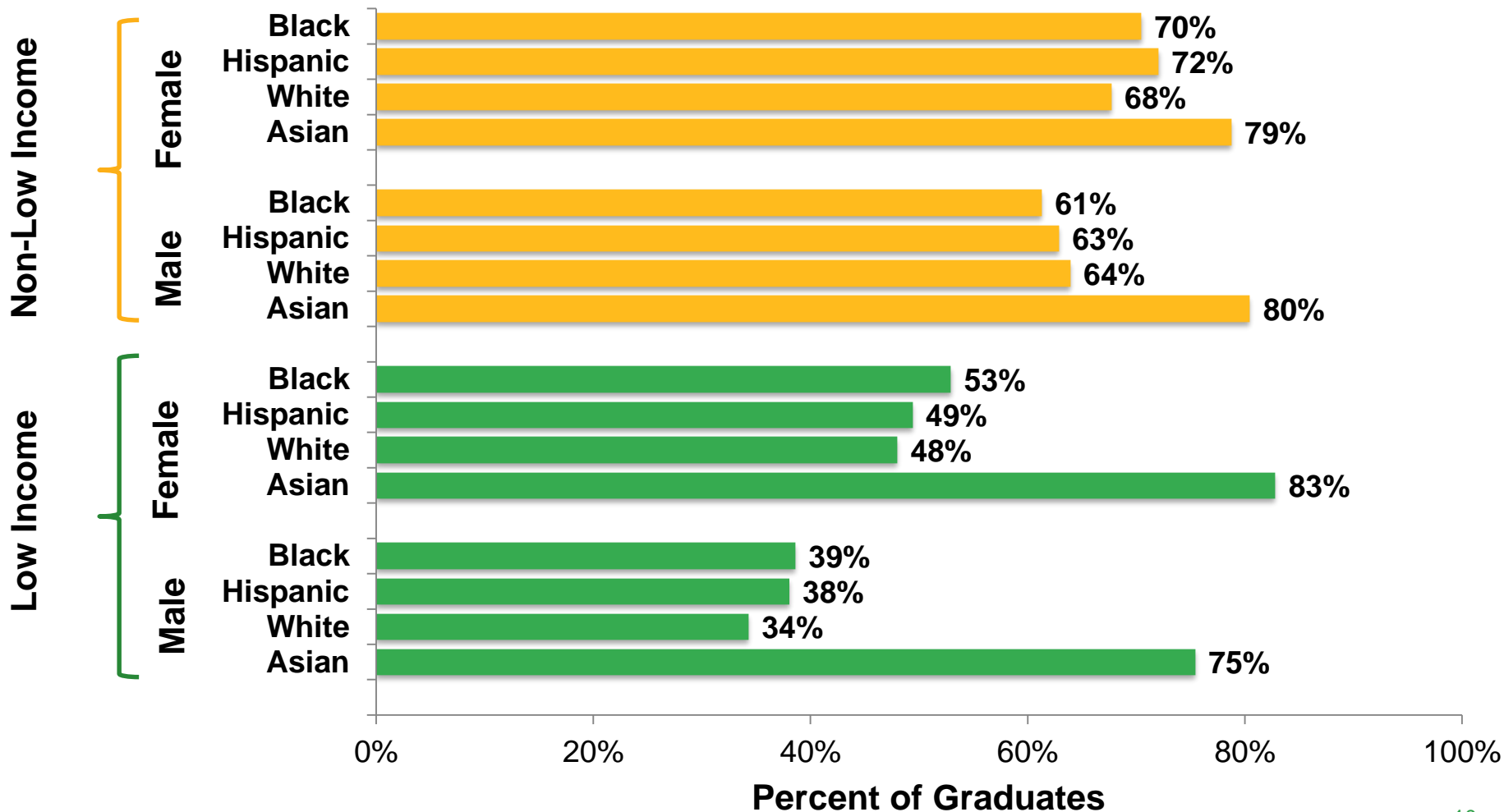


Higher Education Enrollment Among Hispanic Graduates Increased Dramatically Since 2005



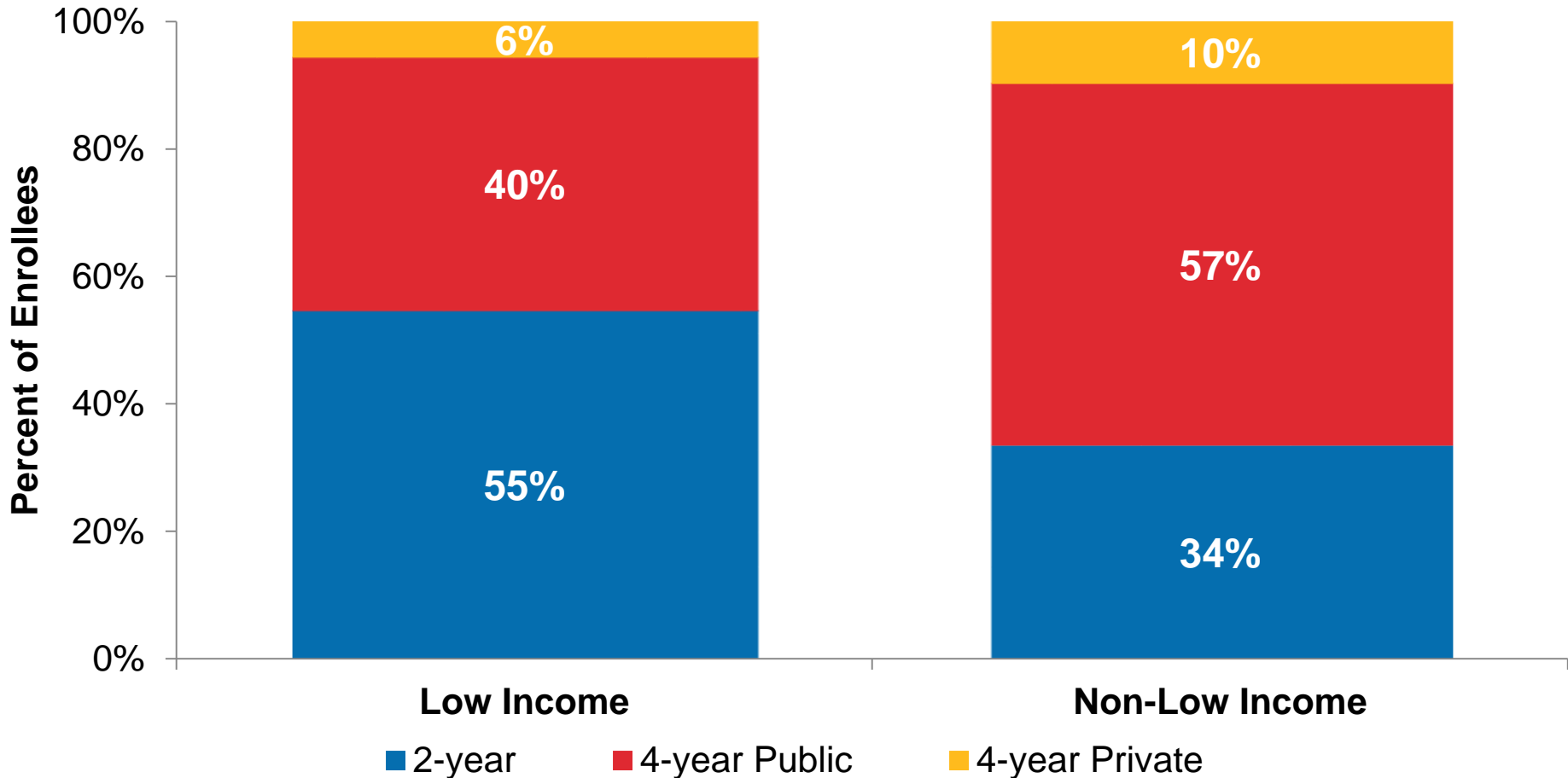
Higher Education Enrollment Rates Vary Widely by Income, Ethnicity, and Gender

Rates of Enrollment in Texas Institutions of Higher Education, Central Texas, Class of 2014



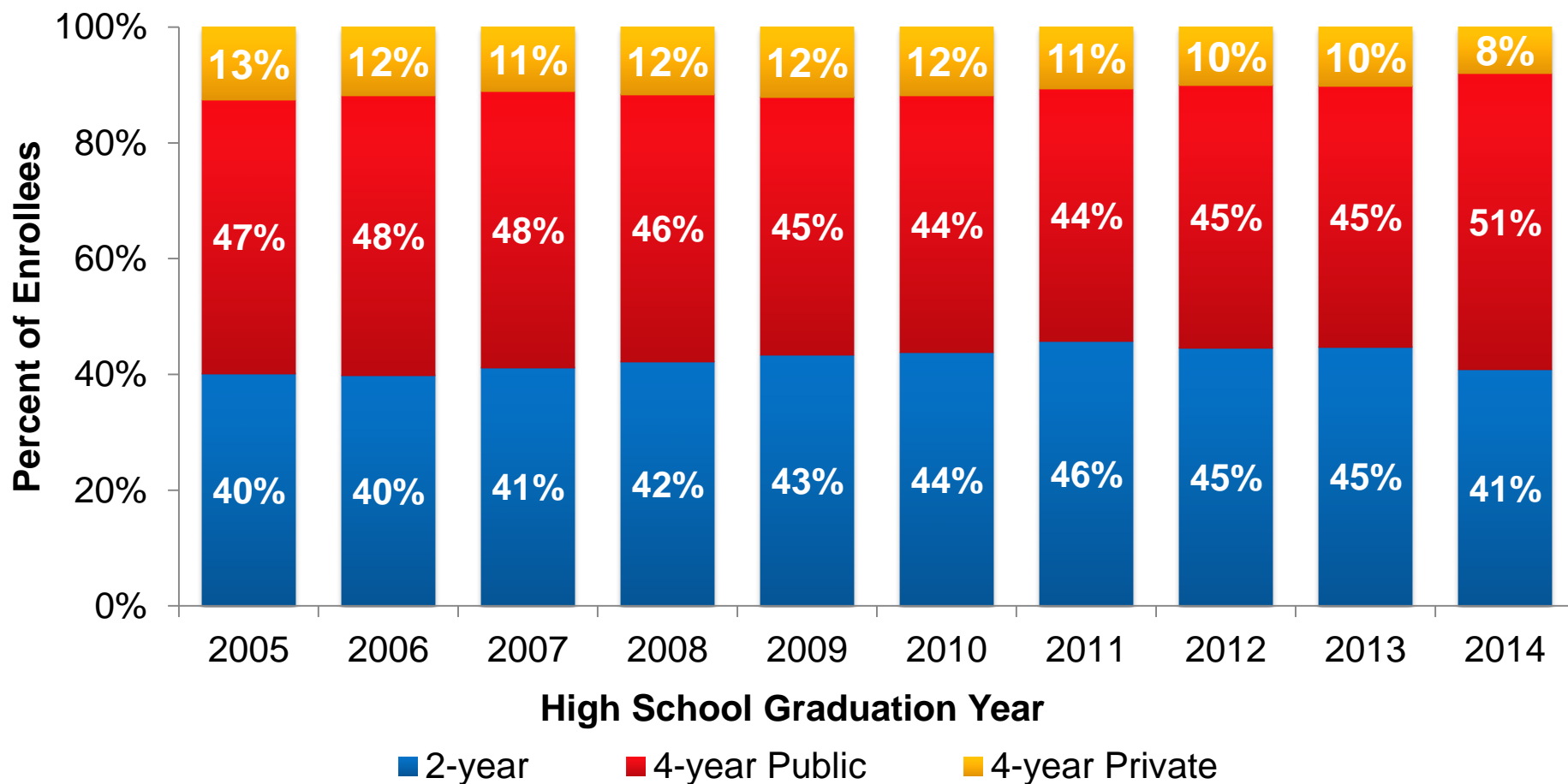
Majority of Low Income Graduates Enrolled In Higher Ed Attend 2-Year Colleges

Central Texas HS Grads Enrolled in Higher Ed in Texas Within 1 Year, Class of 2014



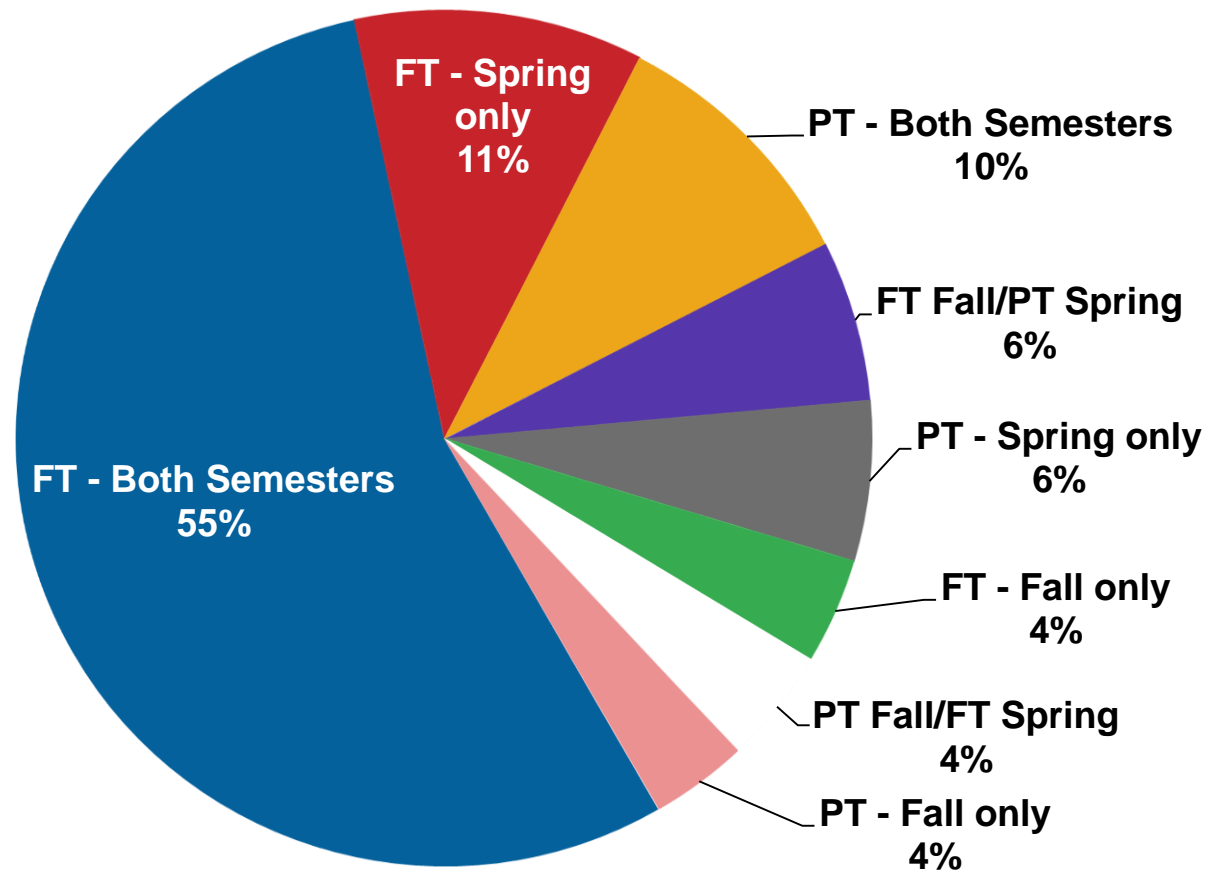
Proportion of Higher Ed Enrollees Attending 2-year Colleges Increased Through 2011

Central Texas HS Graduates Enrolled In Higher Ed in Texas Within One Year



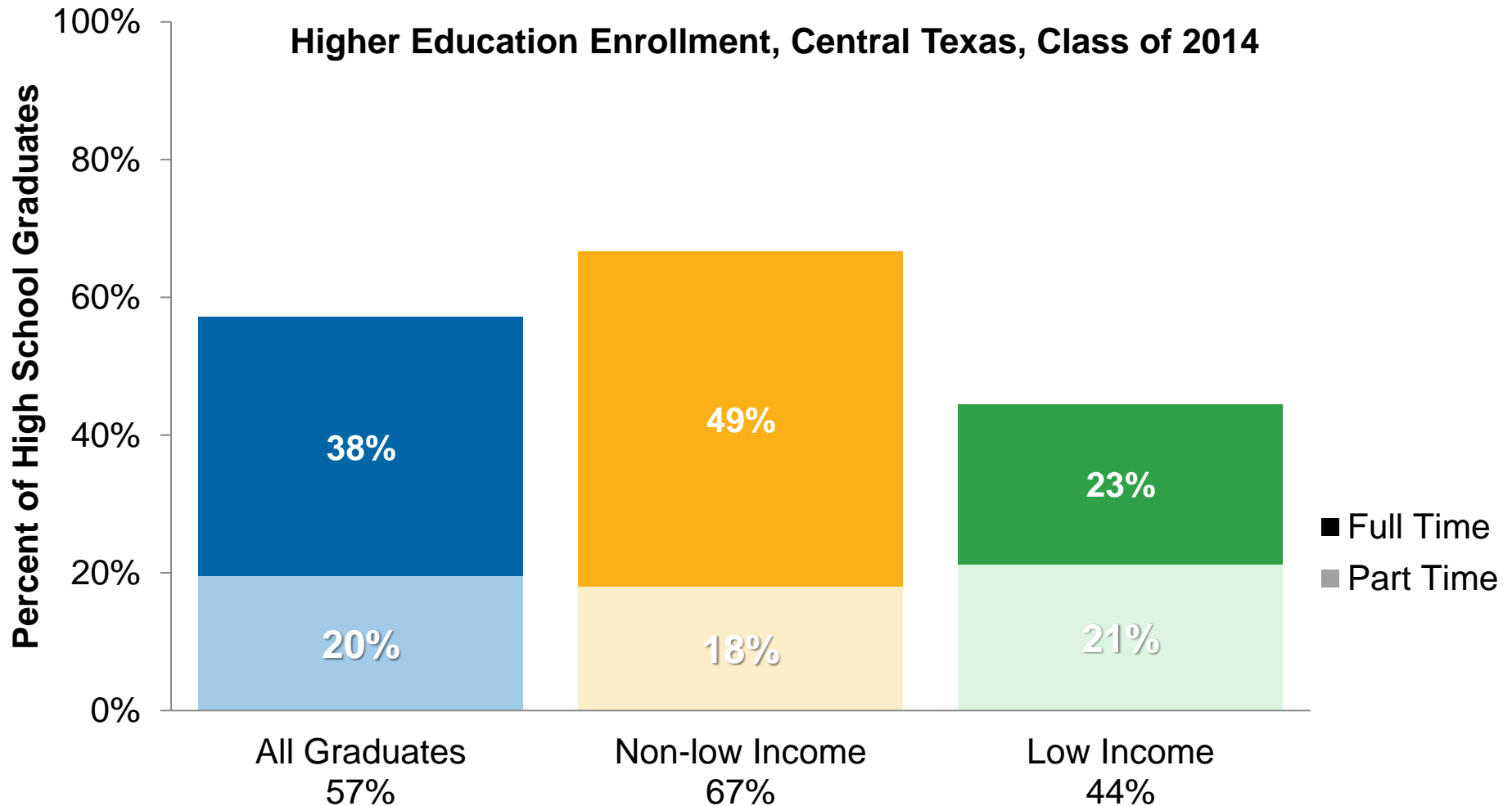

About 20% of High School Graduates Enroll in College Part-Time* Regardless of Income

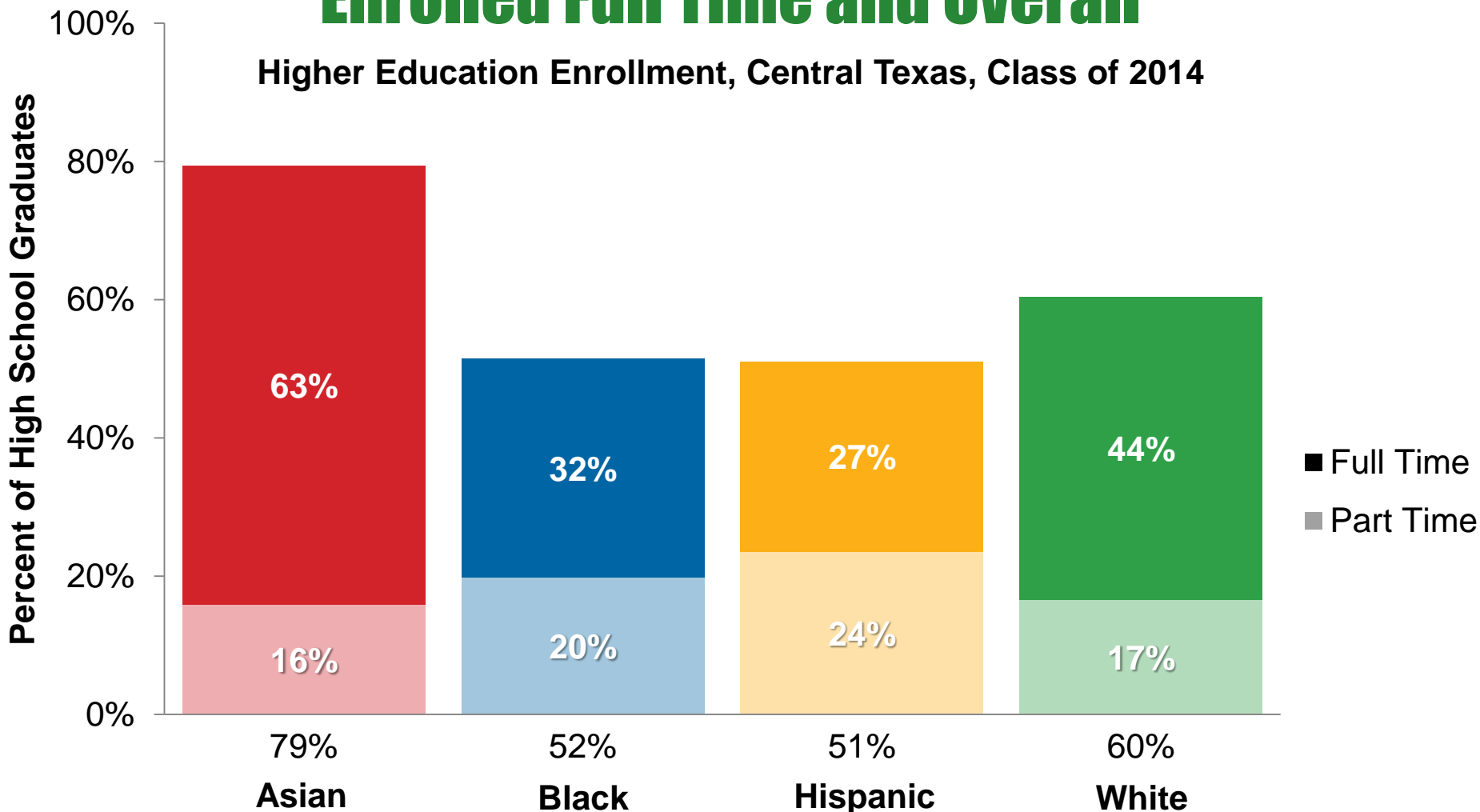

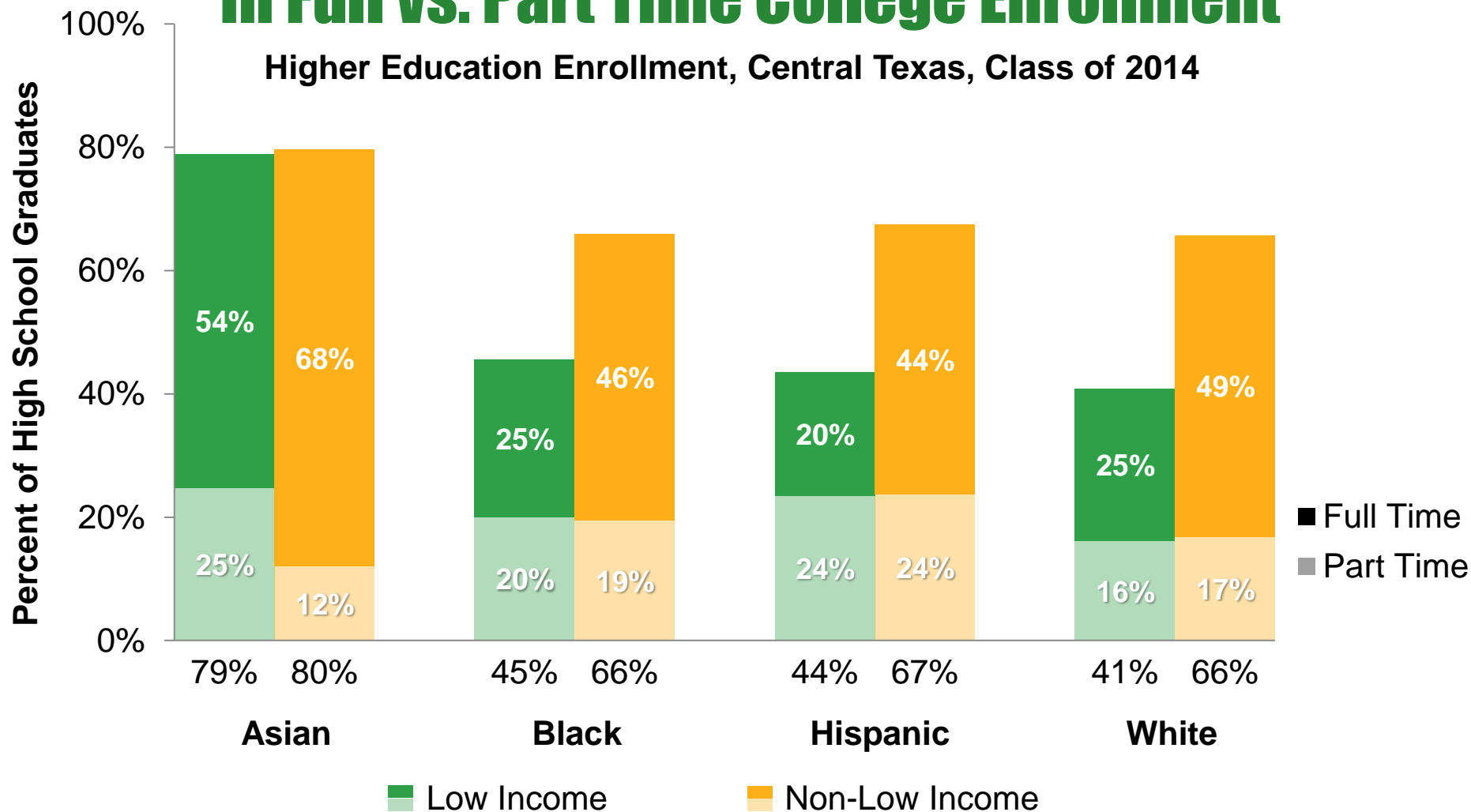

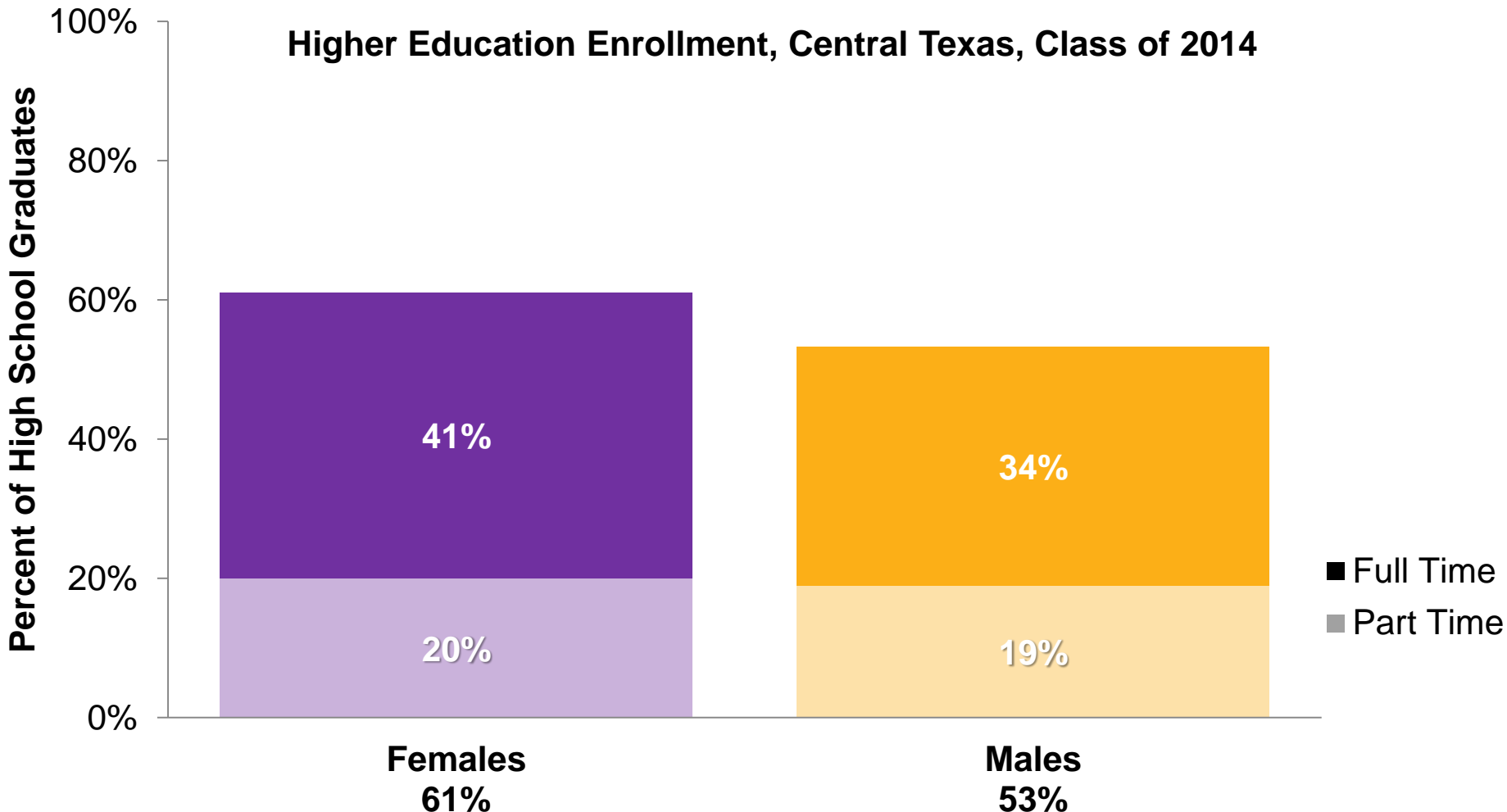

Female High School Graduates Enrolling Full Time at Higher Rates than Males

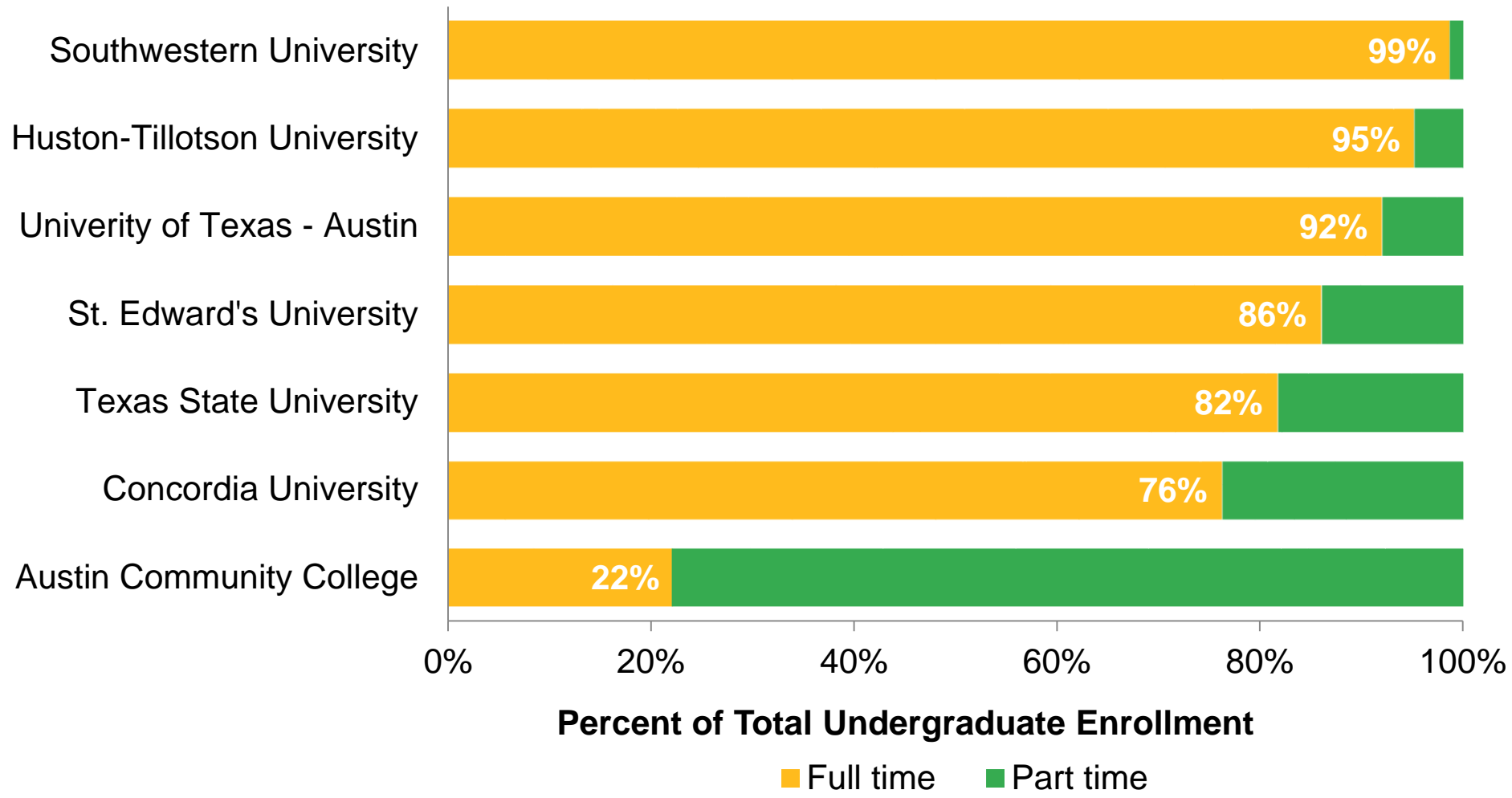
