






#### Austin ISD Student Demographics, School Year 2024-25


















#### Academic Outcomes Comparing Students in Elgin ISD, Region 13, and Texas, 2022-23






#### Elgin ISD Student Demographics, School Year 2024-25
























#### Lake Travis ISD Student Demographics, School Year 2024-25











#### Leander ISD Student Demographics, School Year 2024-25





## Academic Outcomes Comparing Students in Lockhart ISD, Region 13, and Texas, 2022-23


















#### Pflugerville ISD Student Demographics, School Year 2024-25





### Academic Outcomes Comparing Students in Round Rock ISD, Region 13, and Texas, 2022-23
























#### Academic Outcomes Comparing Students in Taylor ISD, Region 13, and Texas, 2022-23


