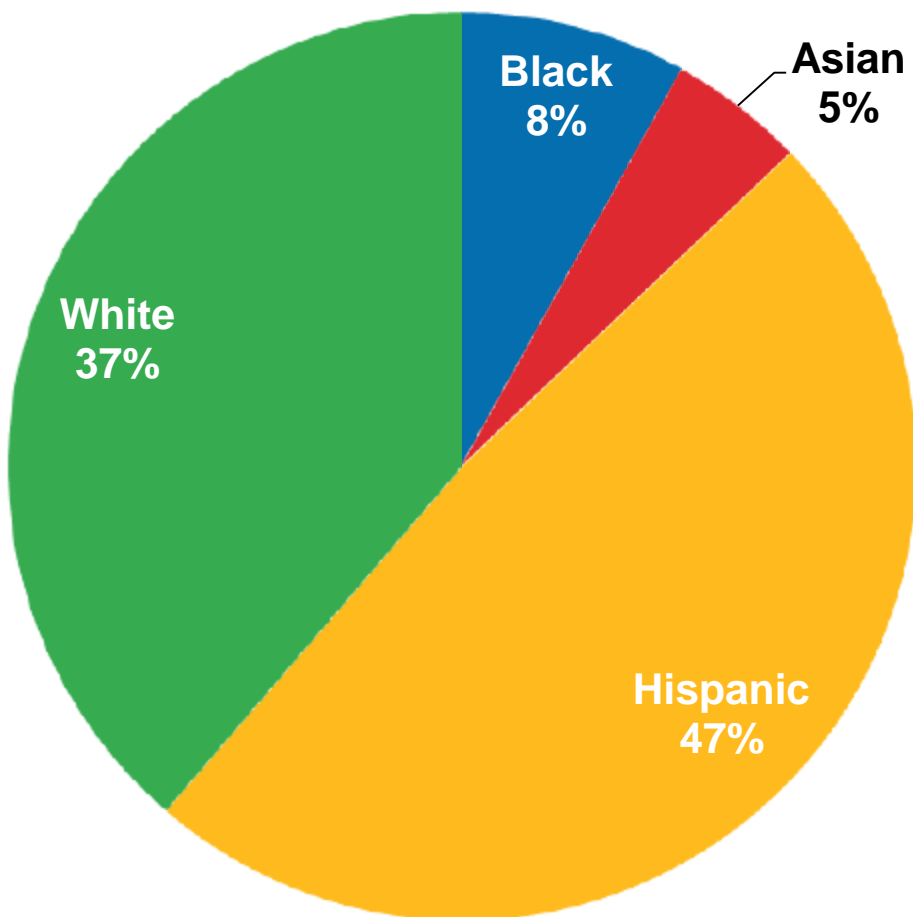
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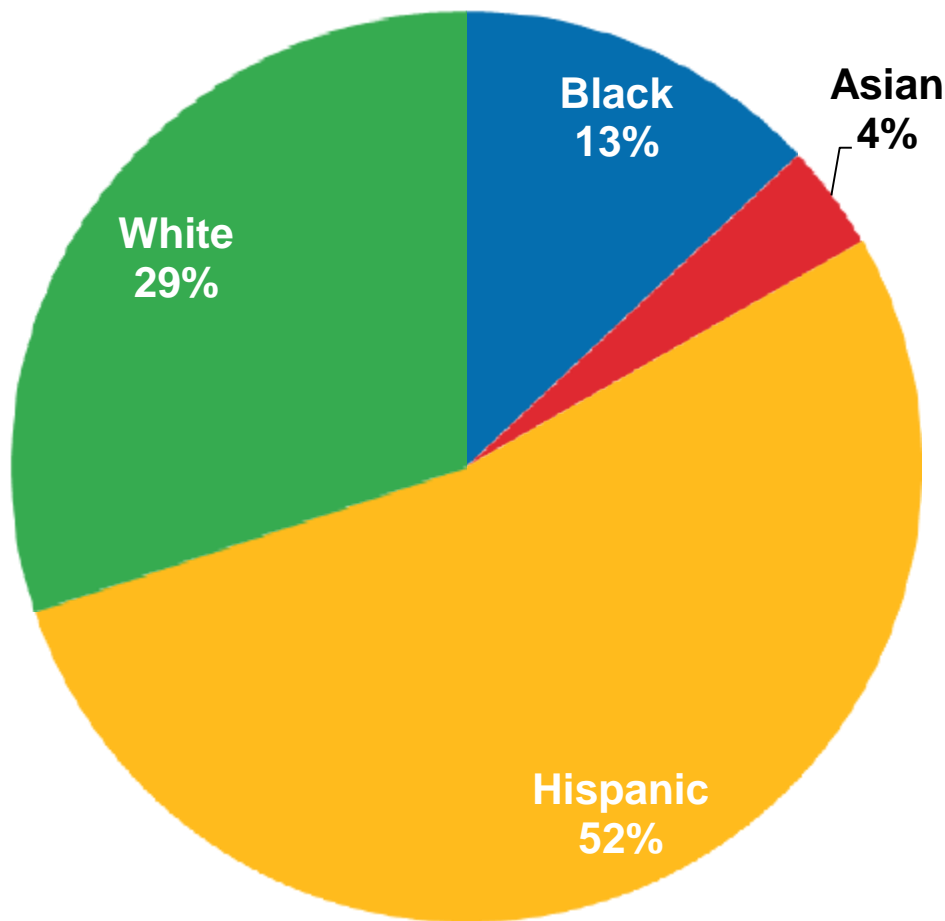
# Lower % Black and Hispanic Students in Central Texas than in Texas

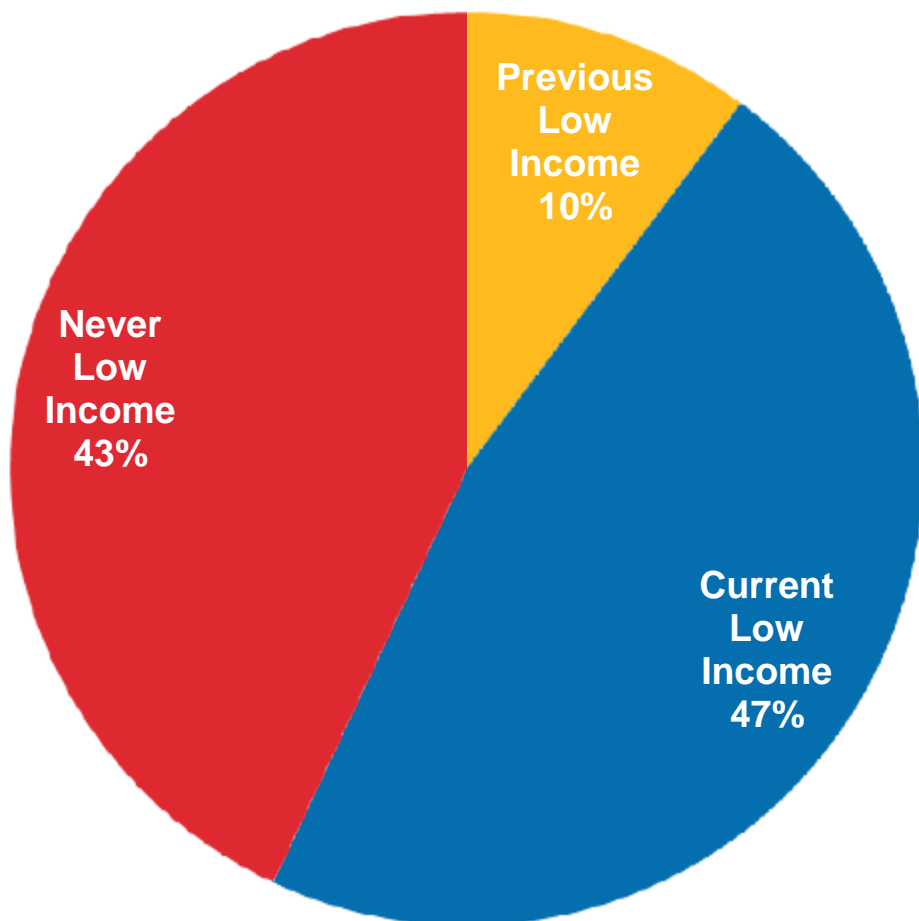

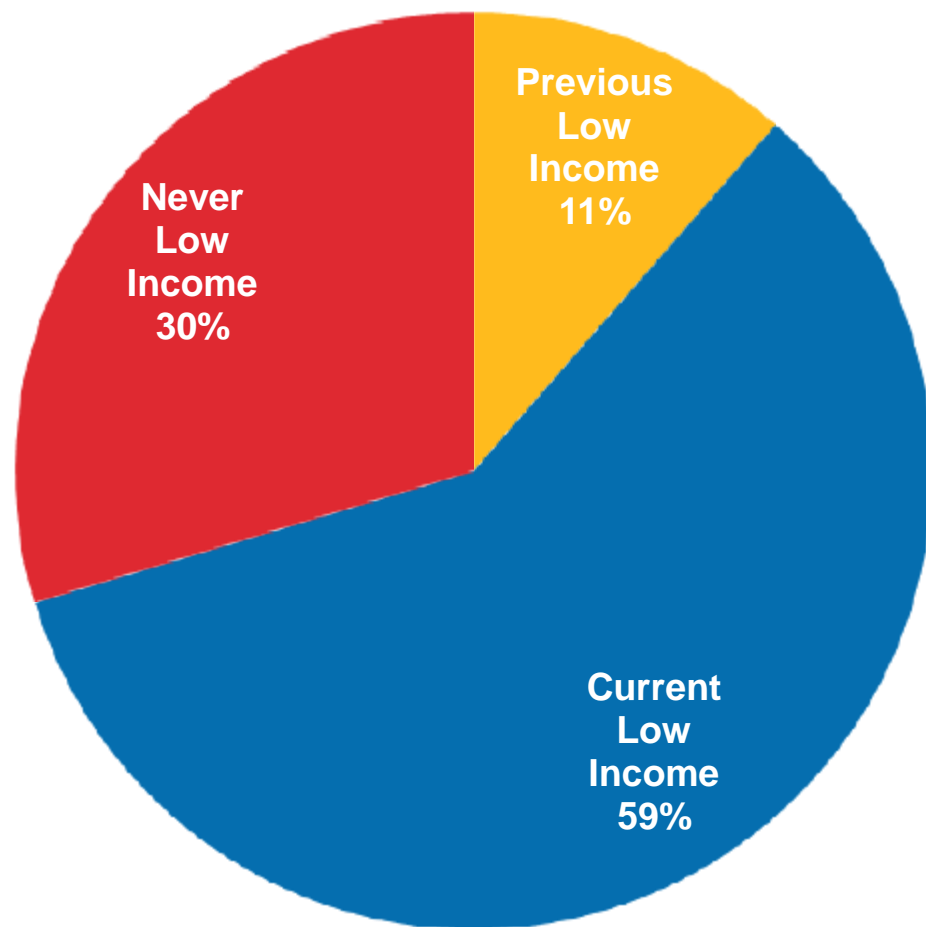
# Low Income Student % Smaller in Central Texas Than in Texas

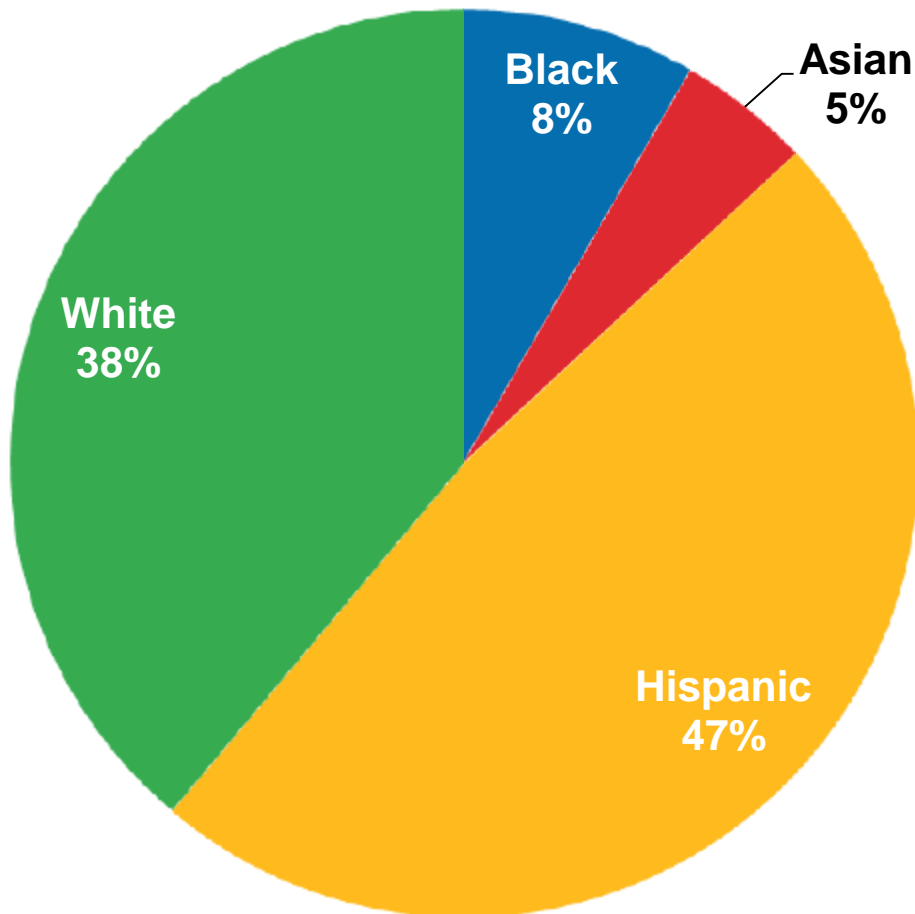

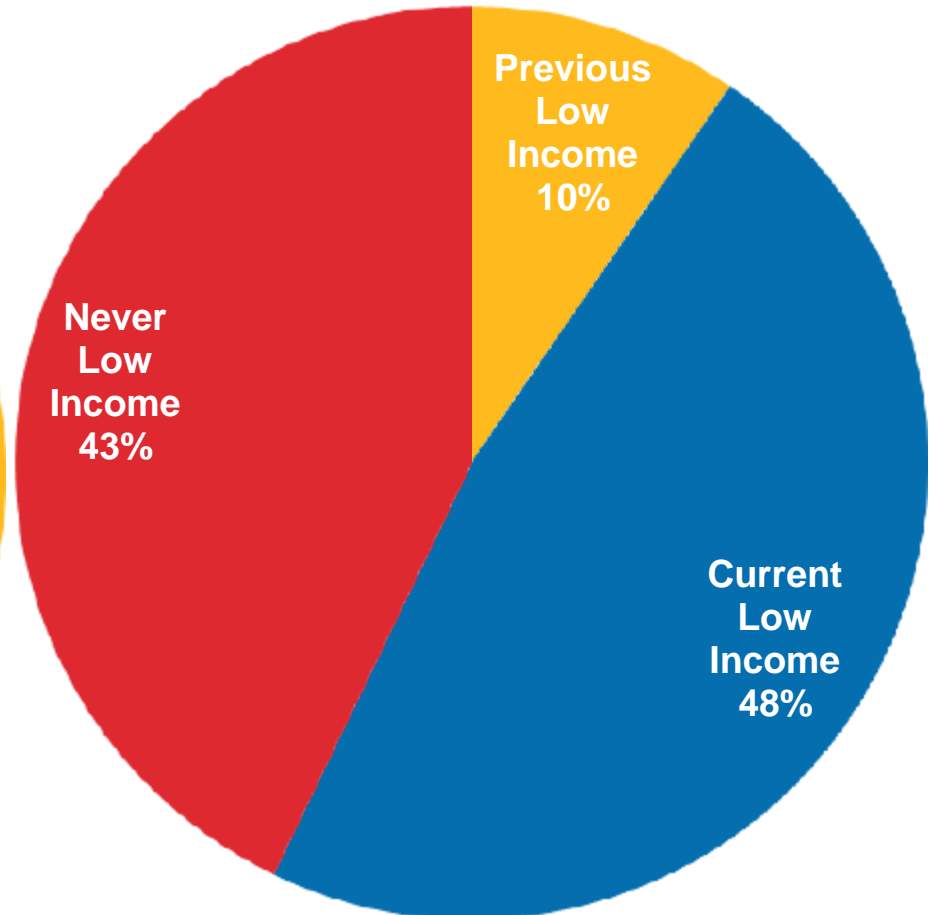


# Central Texas Grades EE-12 Student Demographics

**Ethnicity**



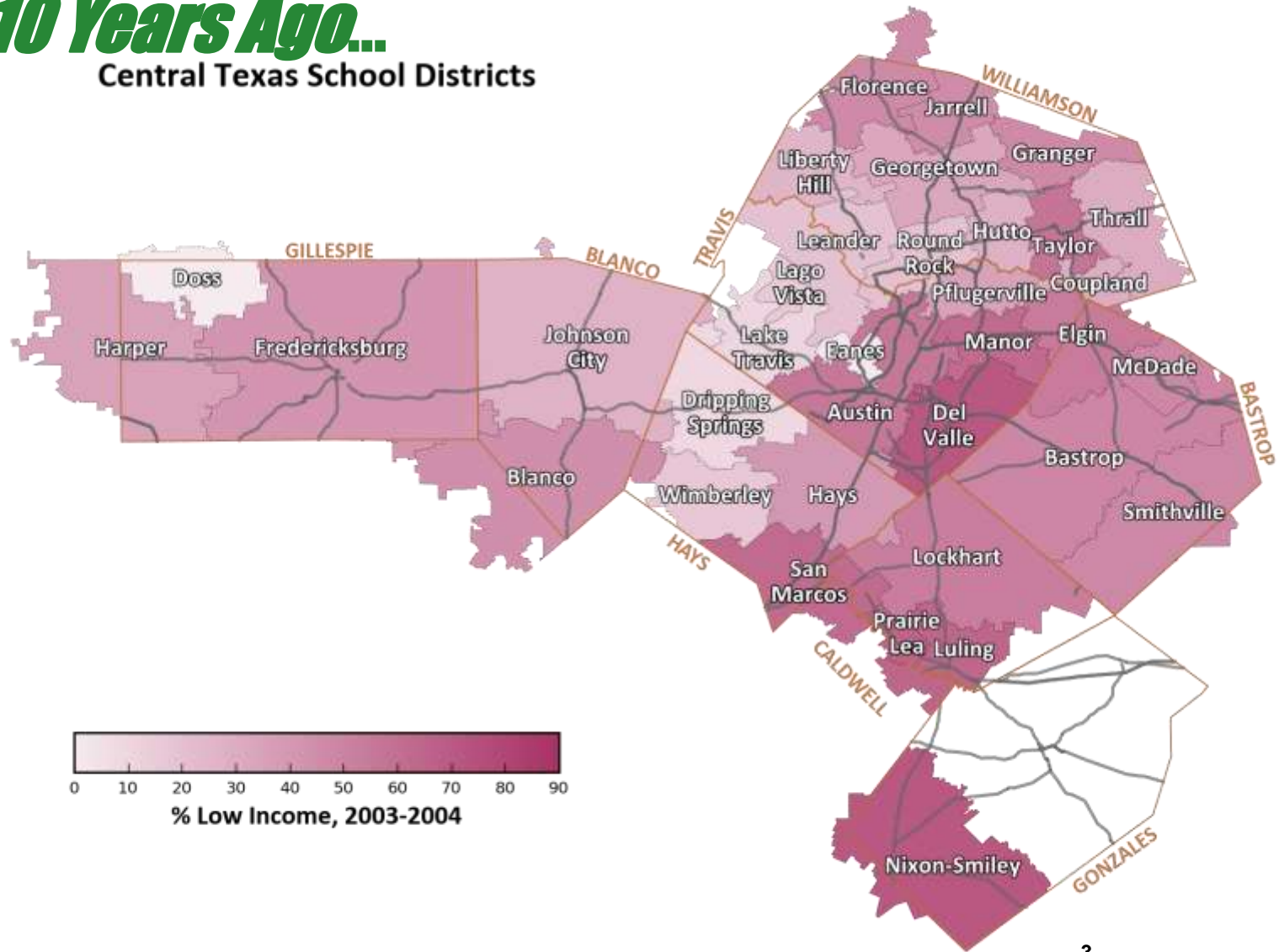

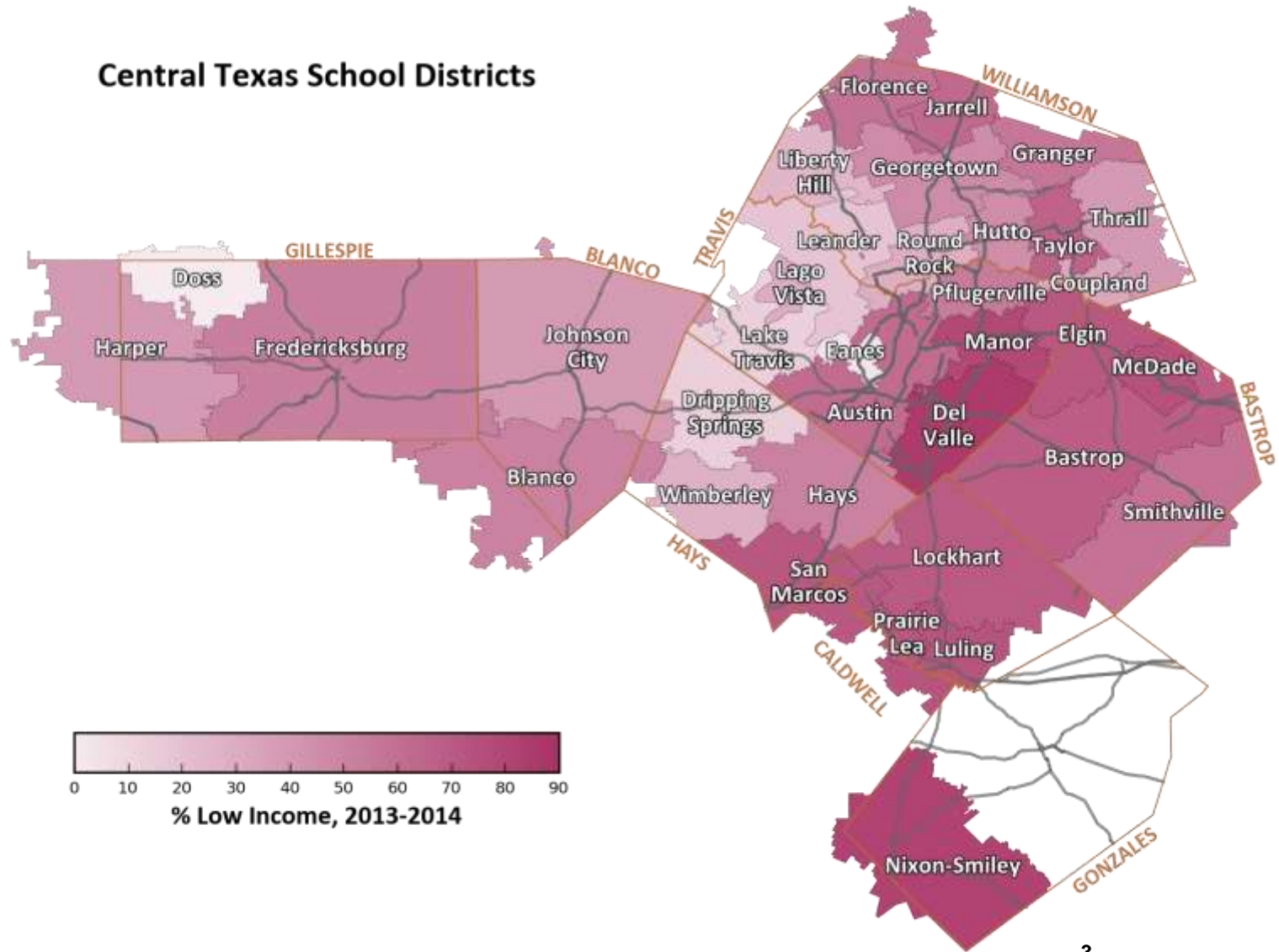
# Central Texas Income Distribution by School District

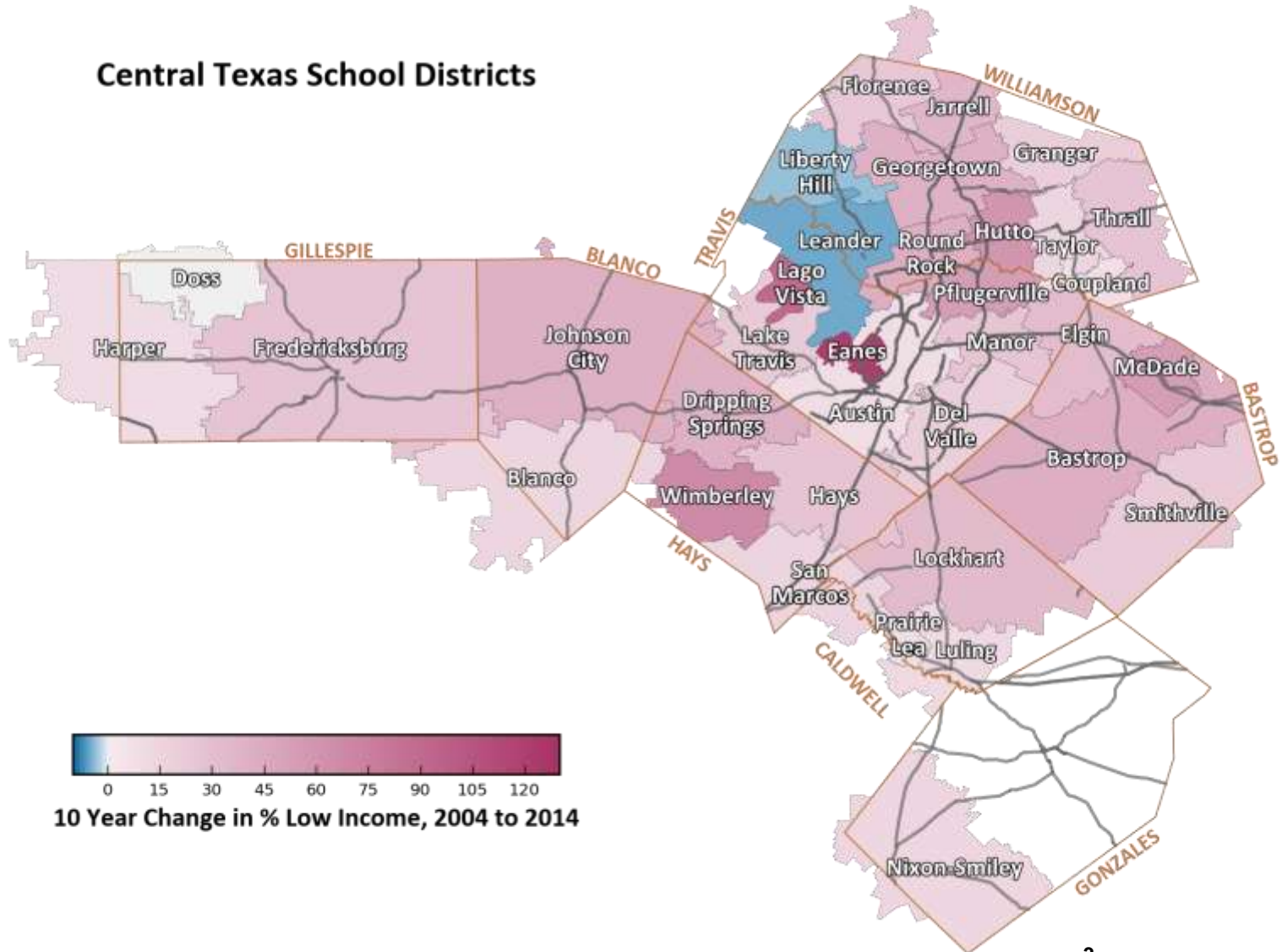


# ...And District Income Distribution Last Year



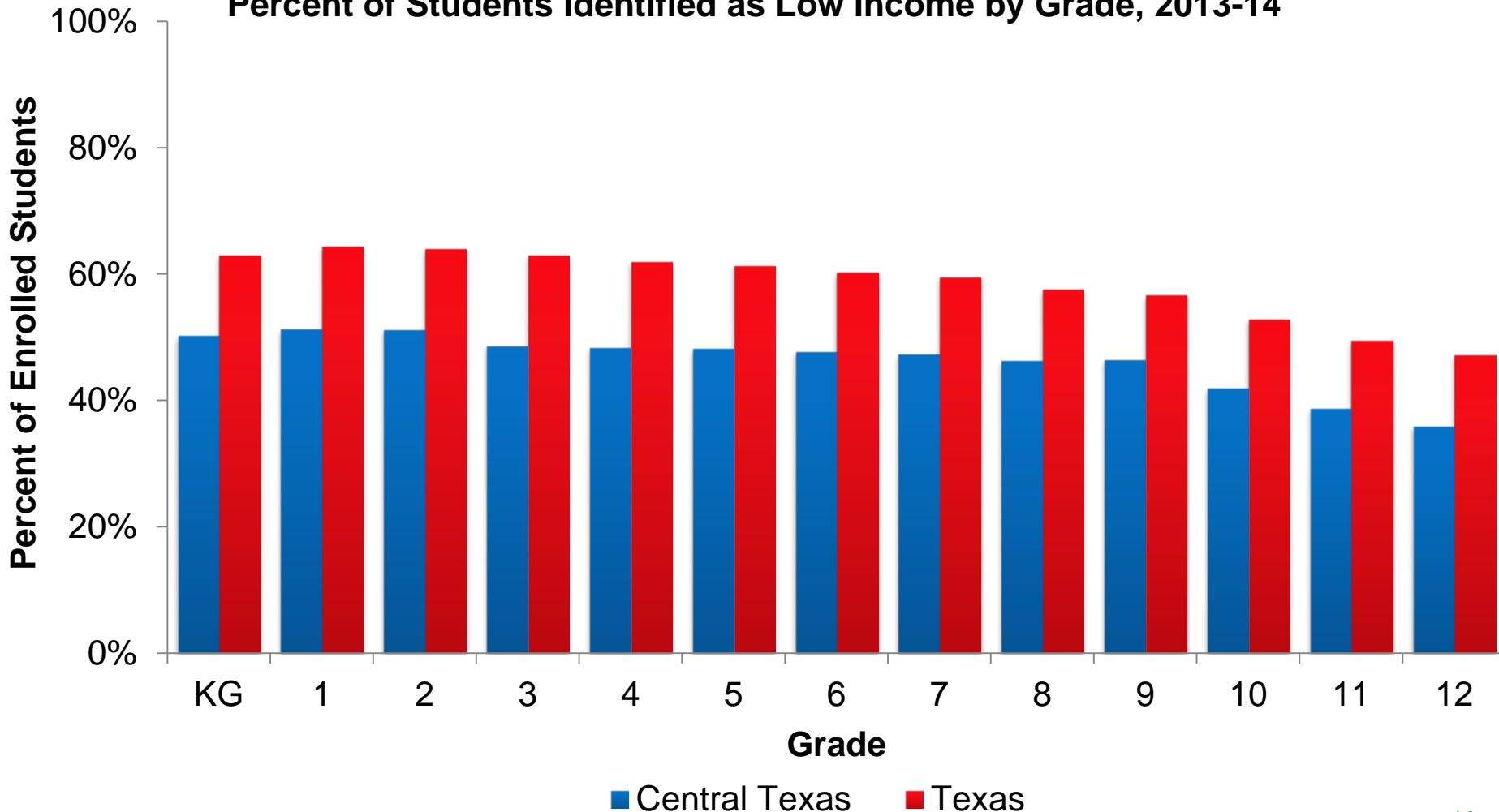


# Low Income Declined in Leander and Liberty Hill ISDs

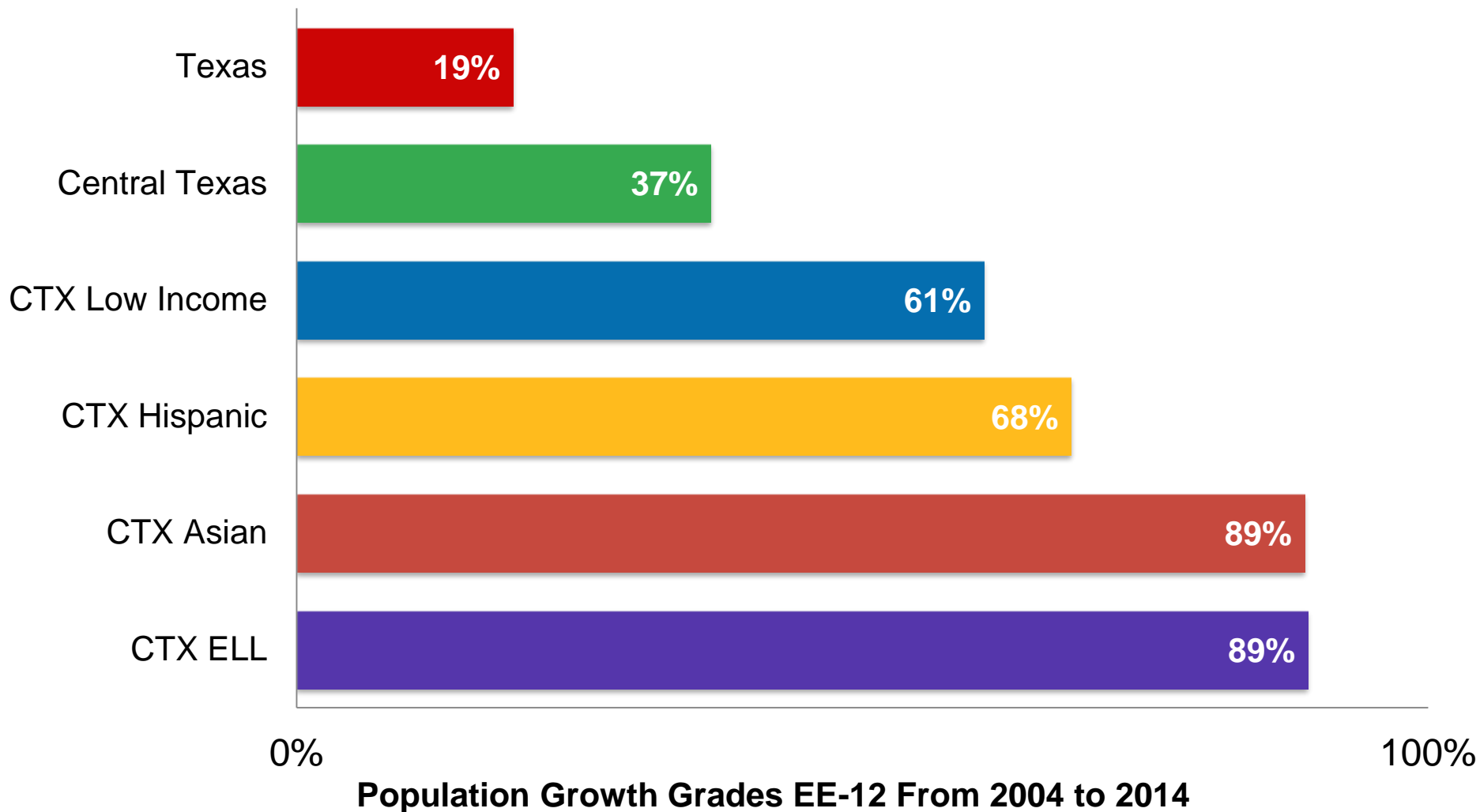


# At All Grades, Smaller % of Low Income Students in Central Texas than in Texas

Percent of Students Identified as Low Income by Grade, 2013-14

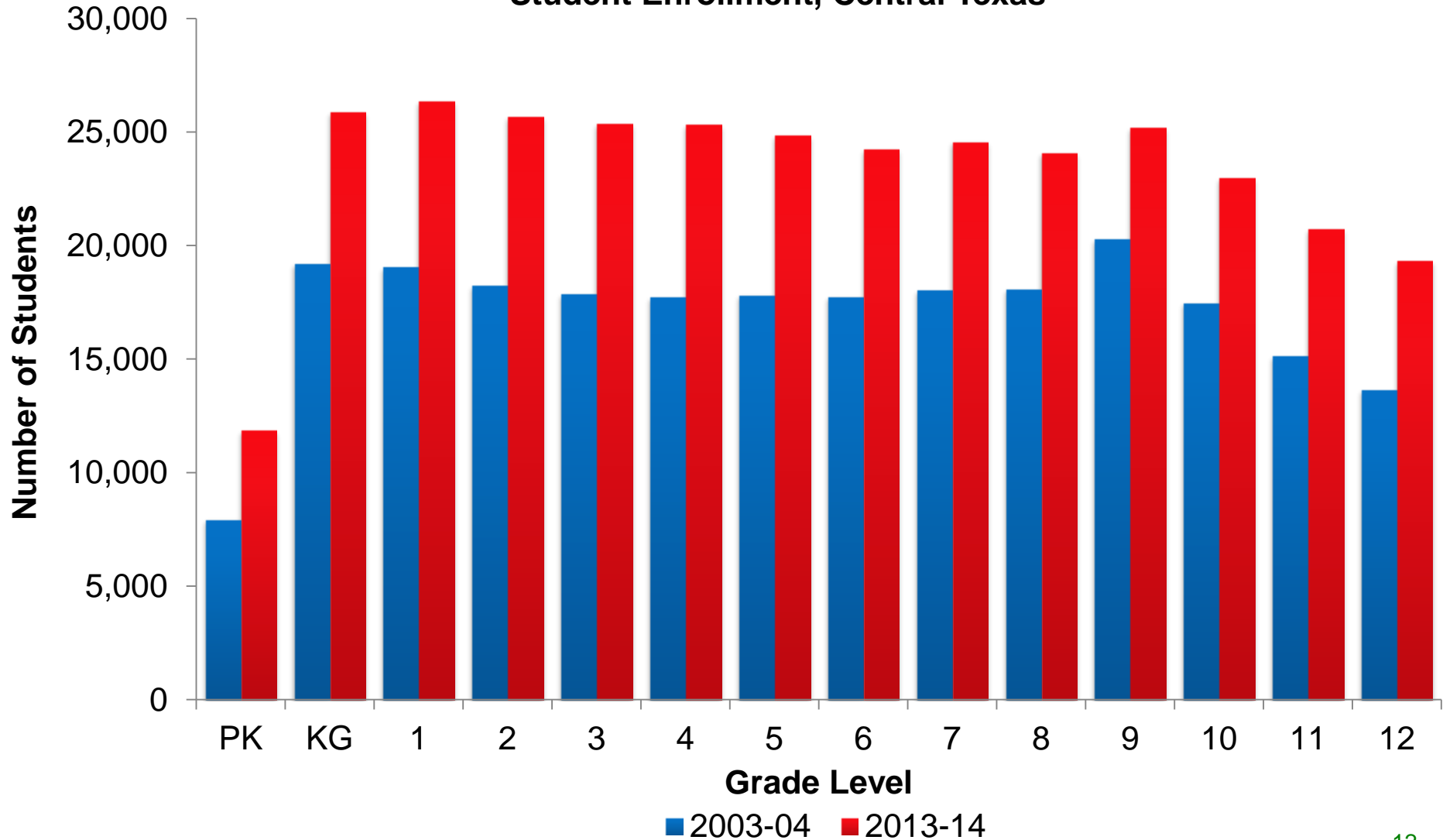


# Dramatic Increases in Student Population Over Last Decade



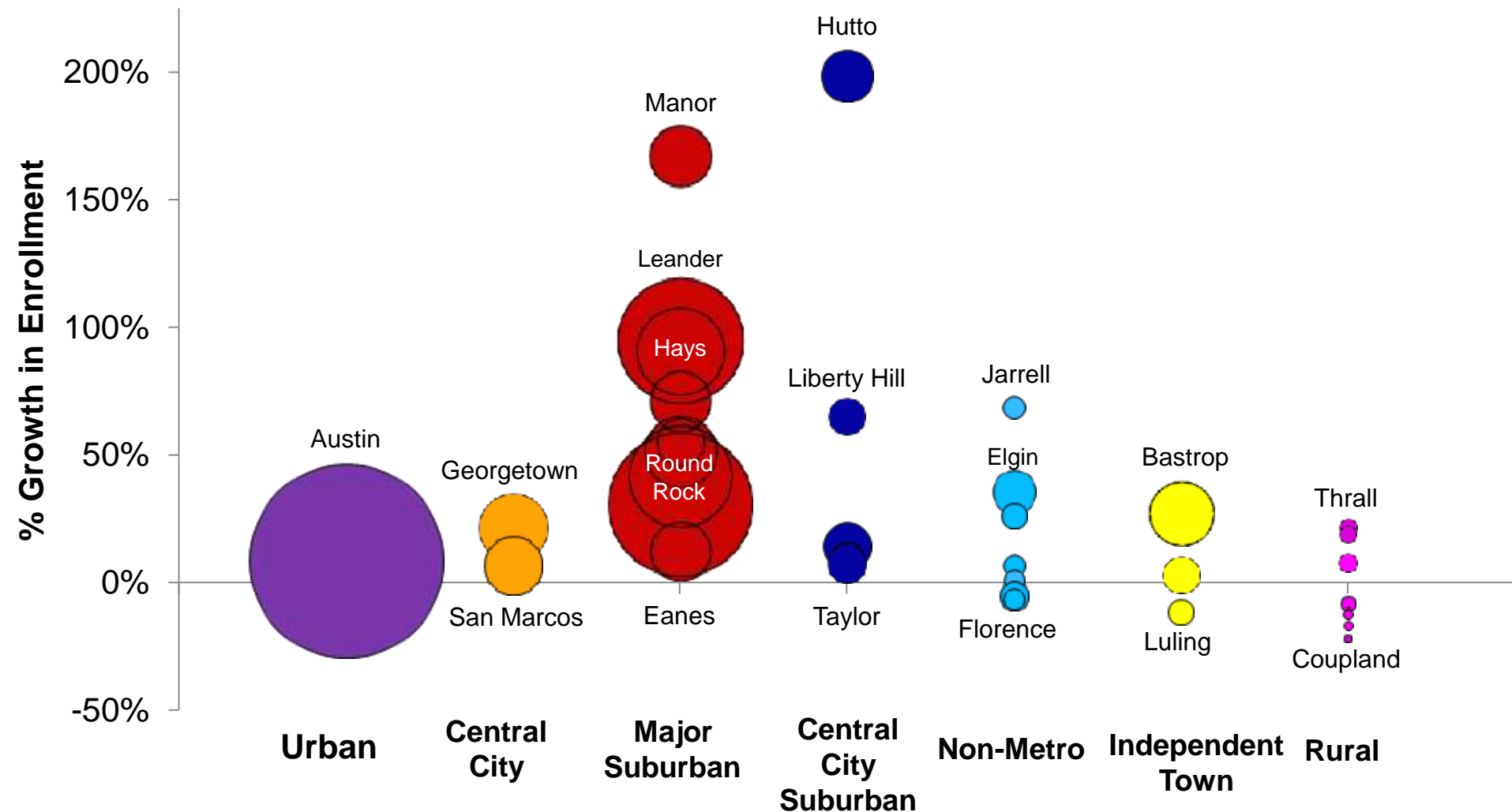
# Significant Growth in All Grades Over Last Decade

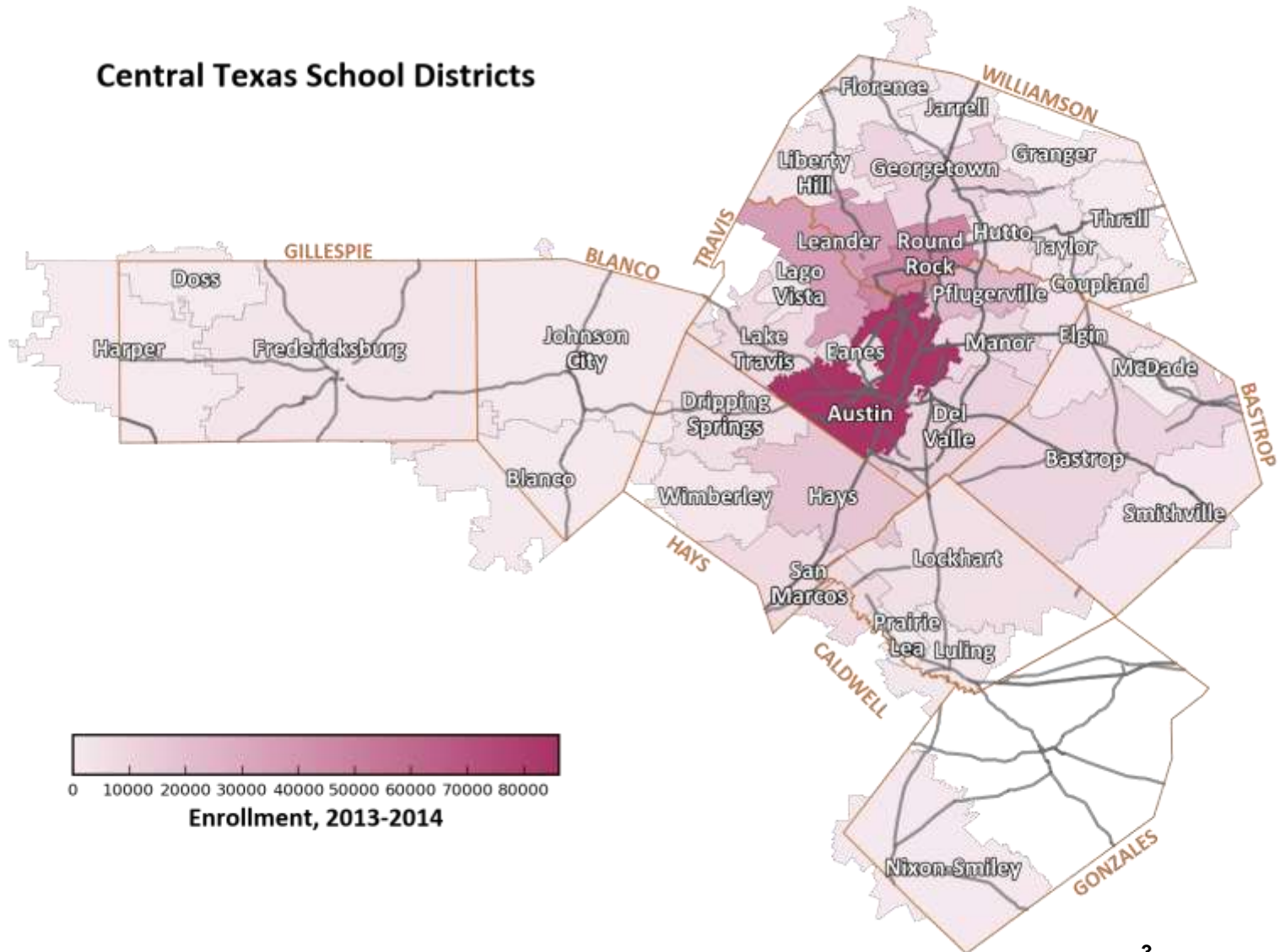


# Fastest K-12 Enrollment Growth in Suburban Areas

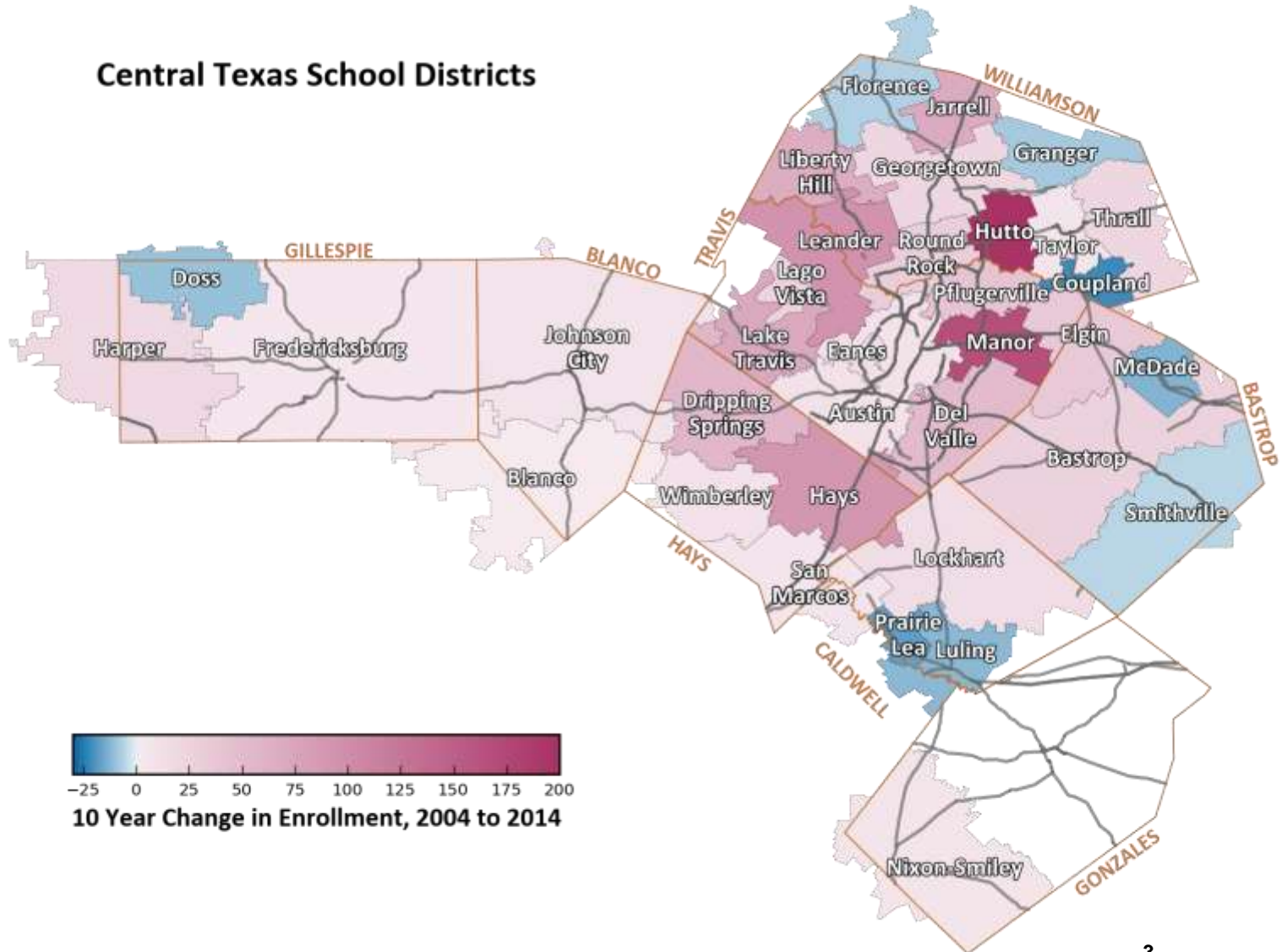
Student Enrollment Growth by District Type, 2003-04 to 2013-14

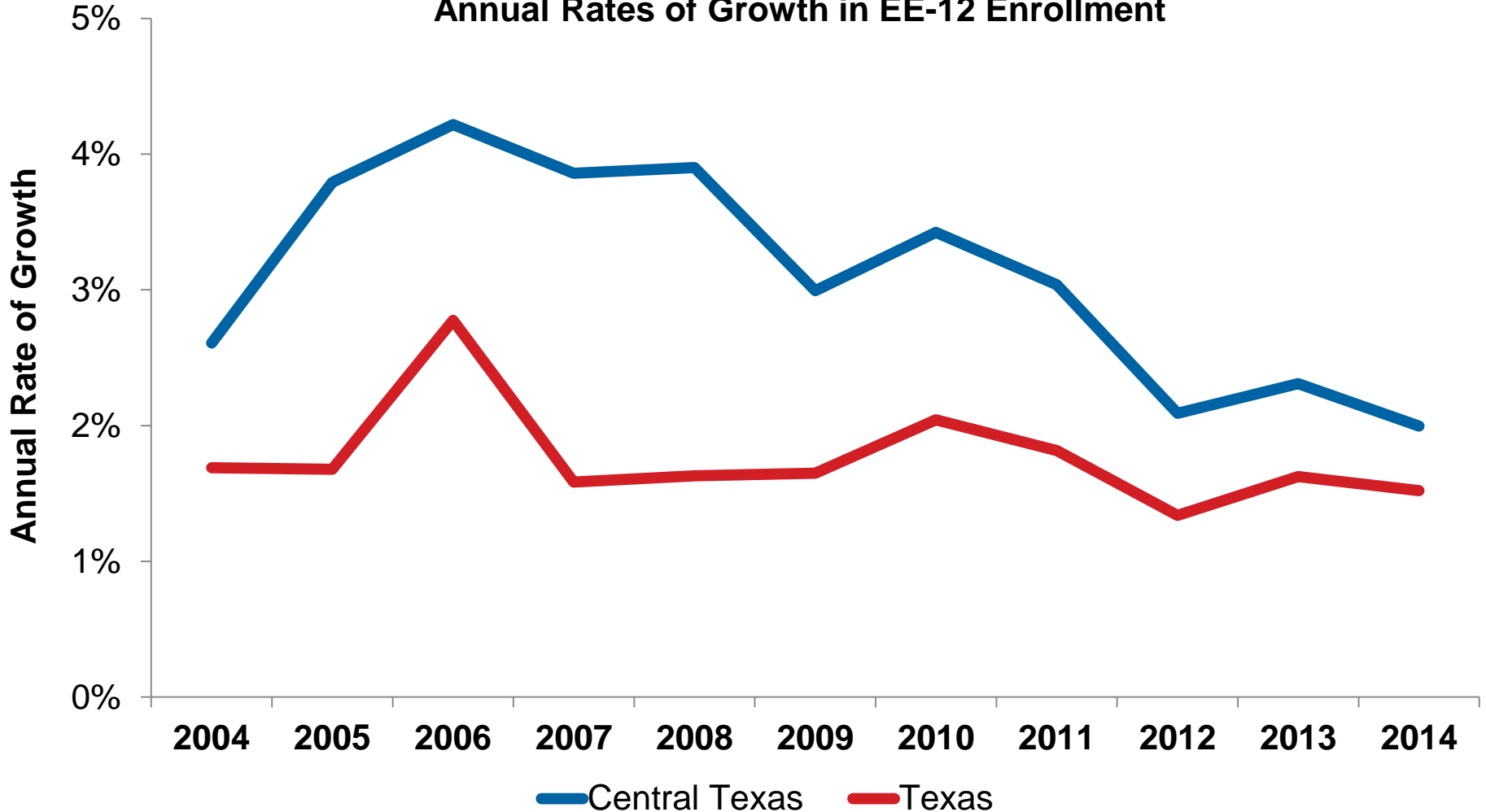


# Enrollment Growth Rates Greatest in Hutto and Manor



# Enrollment Growth Rate in Central Texas Peaked in 2006

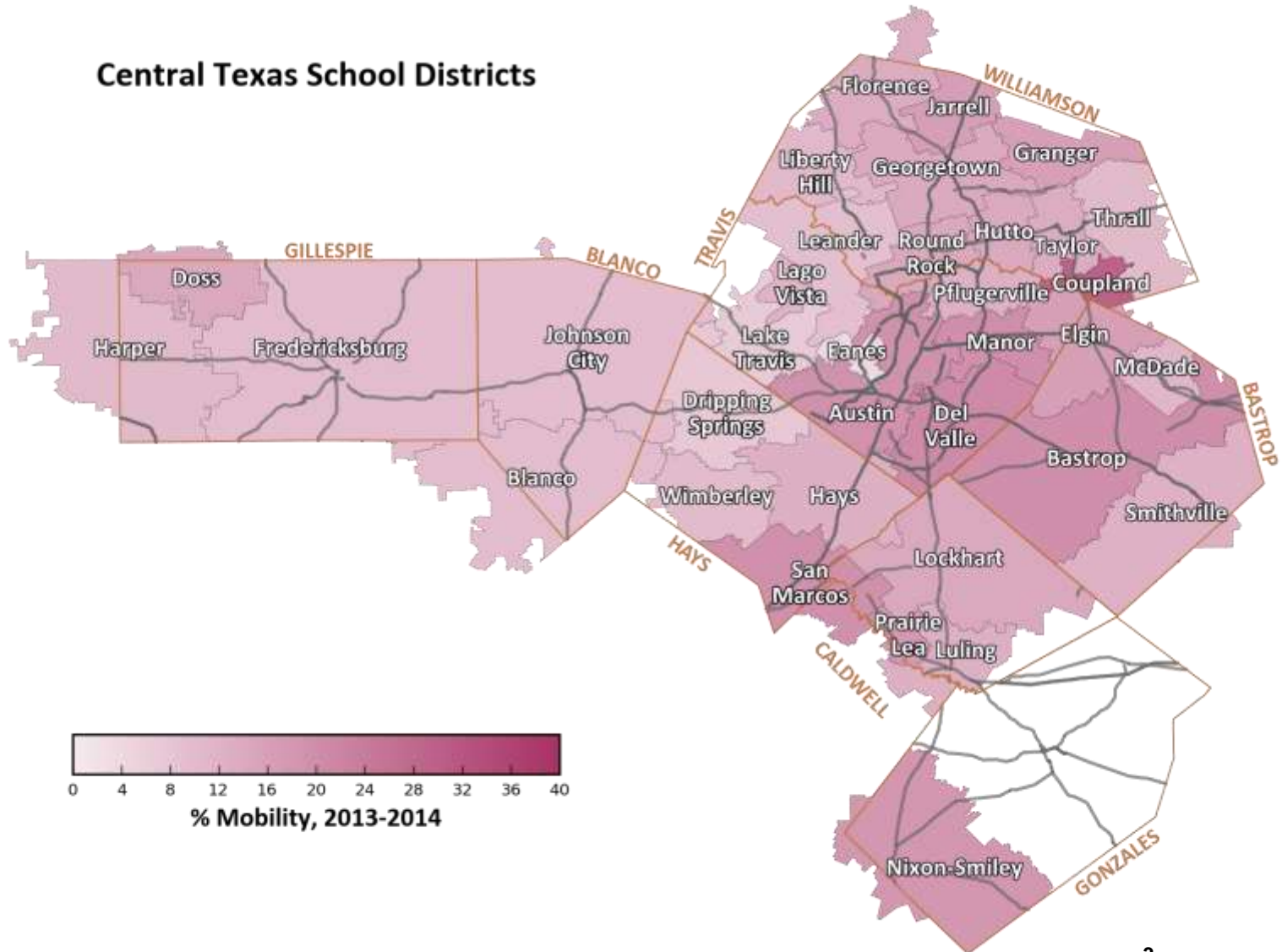
Annual Rates of Growth in EE-12 Enrollment





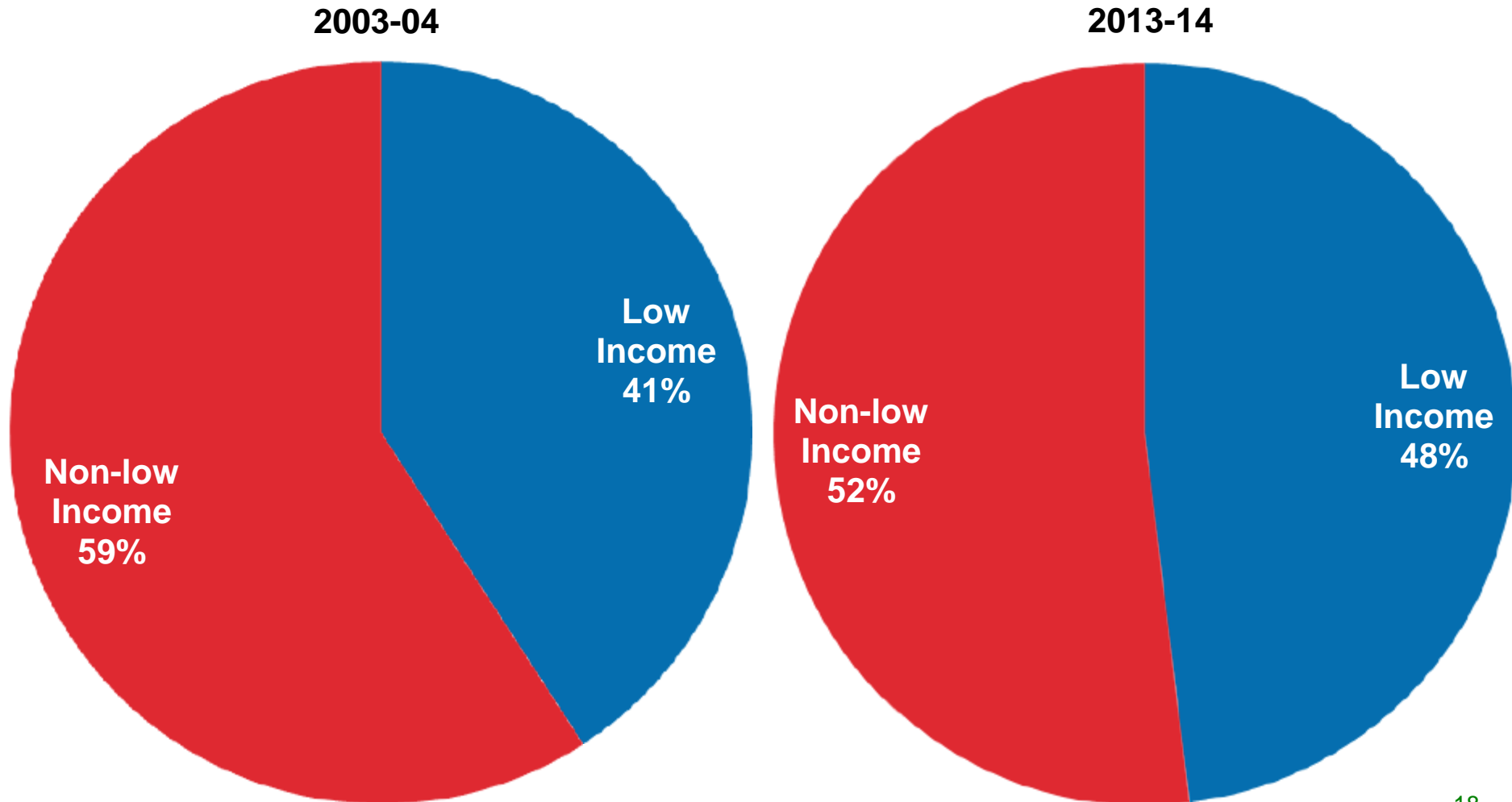
# Mobility Rates Highest in Coupland ISD

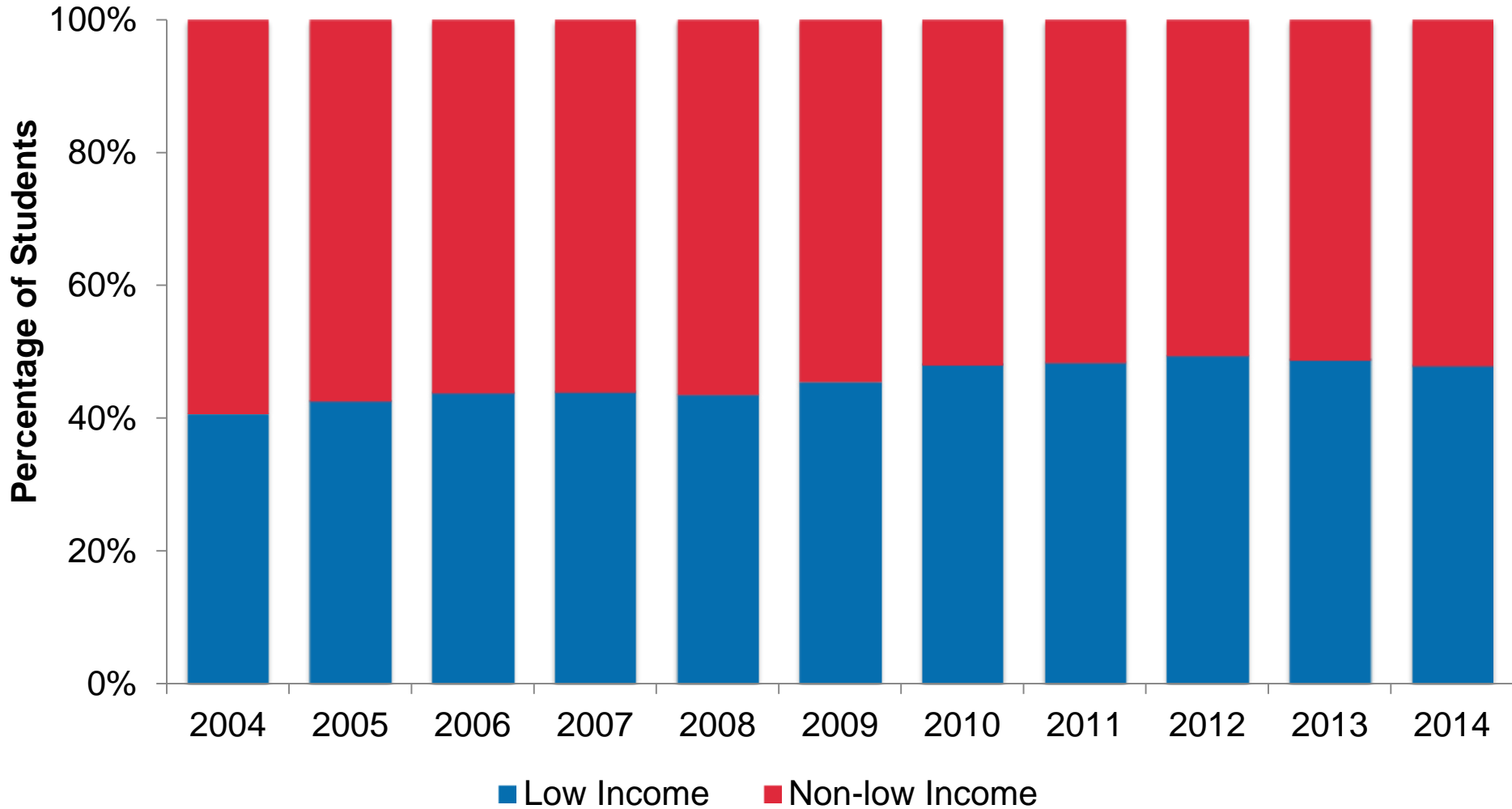
# Larger % of Students Low Income Than 10 Years Ago

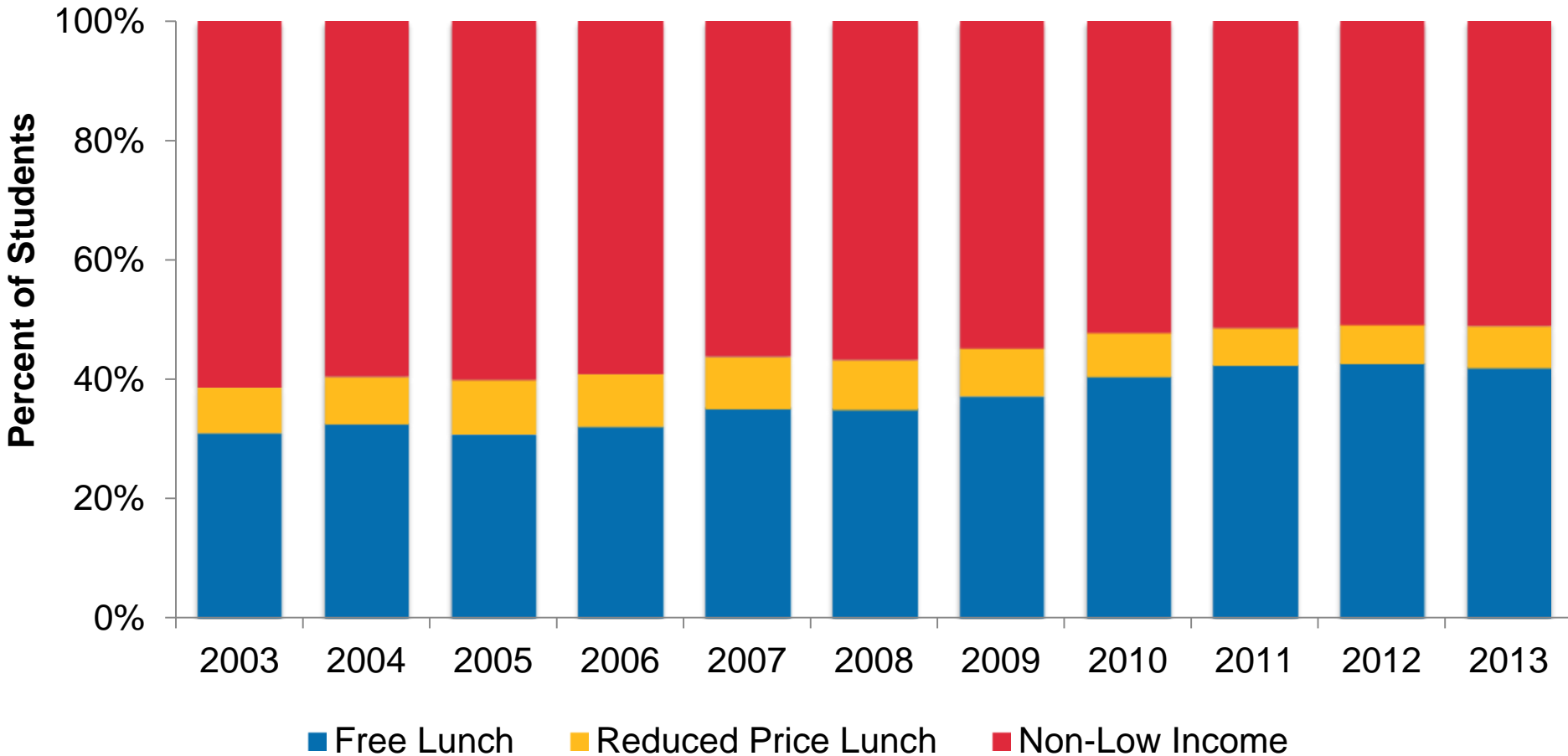
# Student Population Grew Poorer Through 2012

Central Texas, 2003-04 to 2013-14



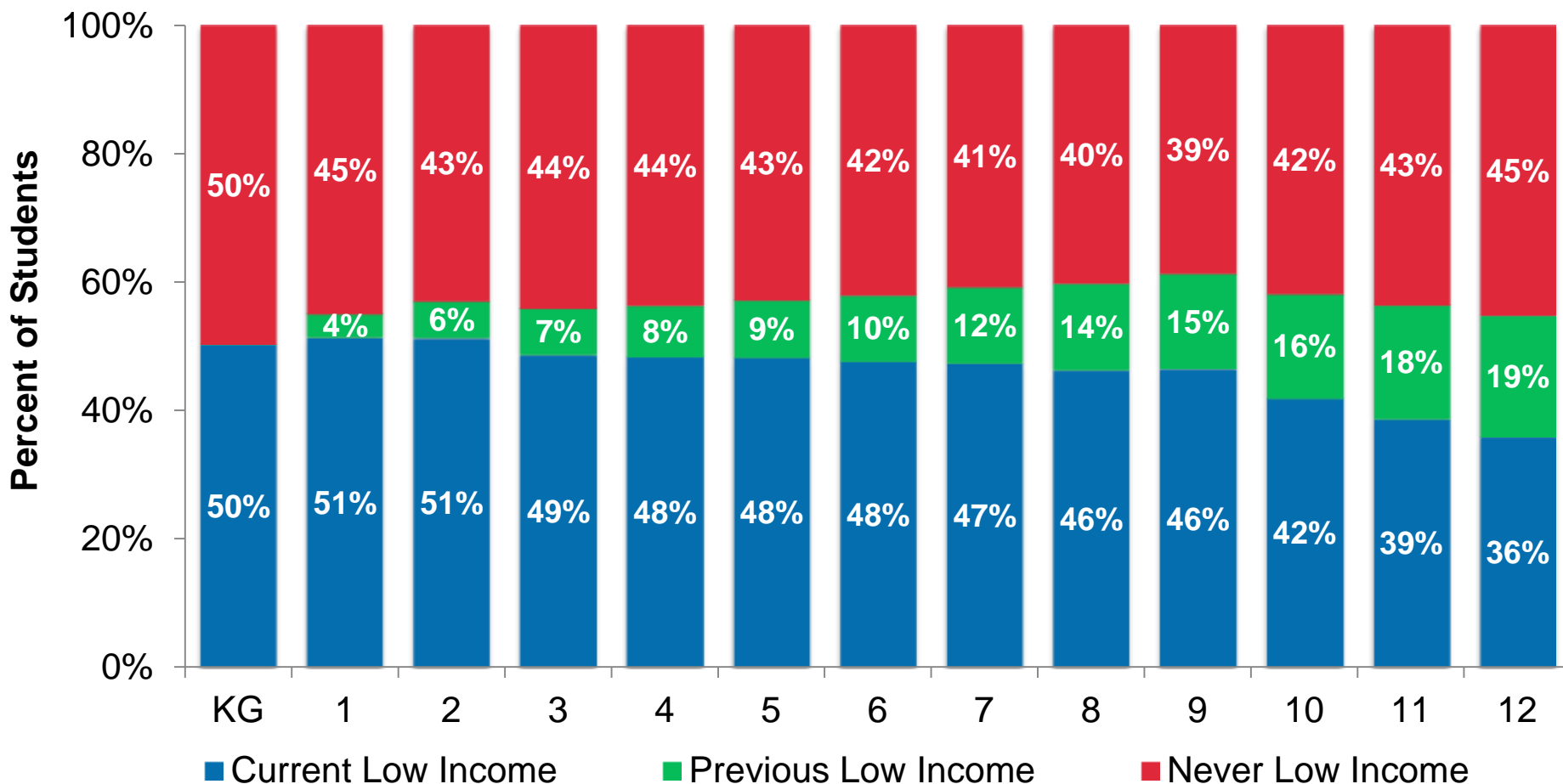
# Percentage of Students Eligible for Free Lunch Increased over Time

Central Texas, 2003-2013**



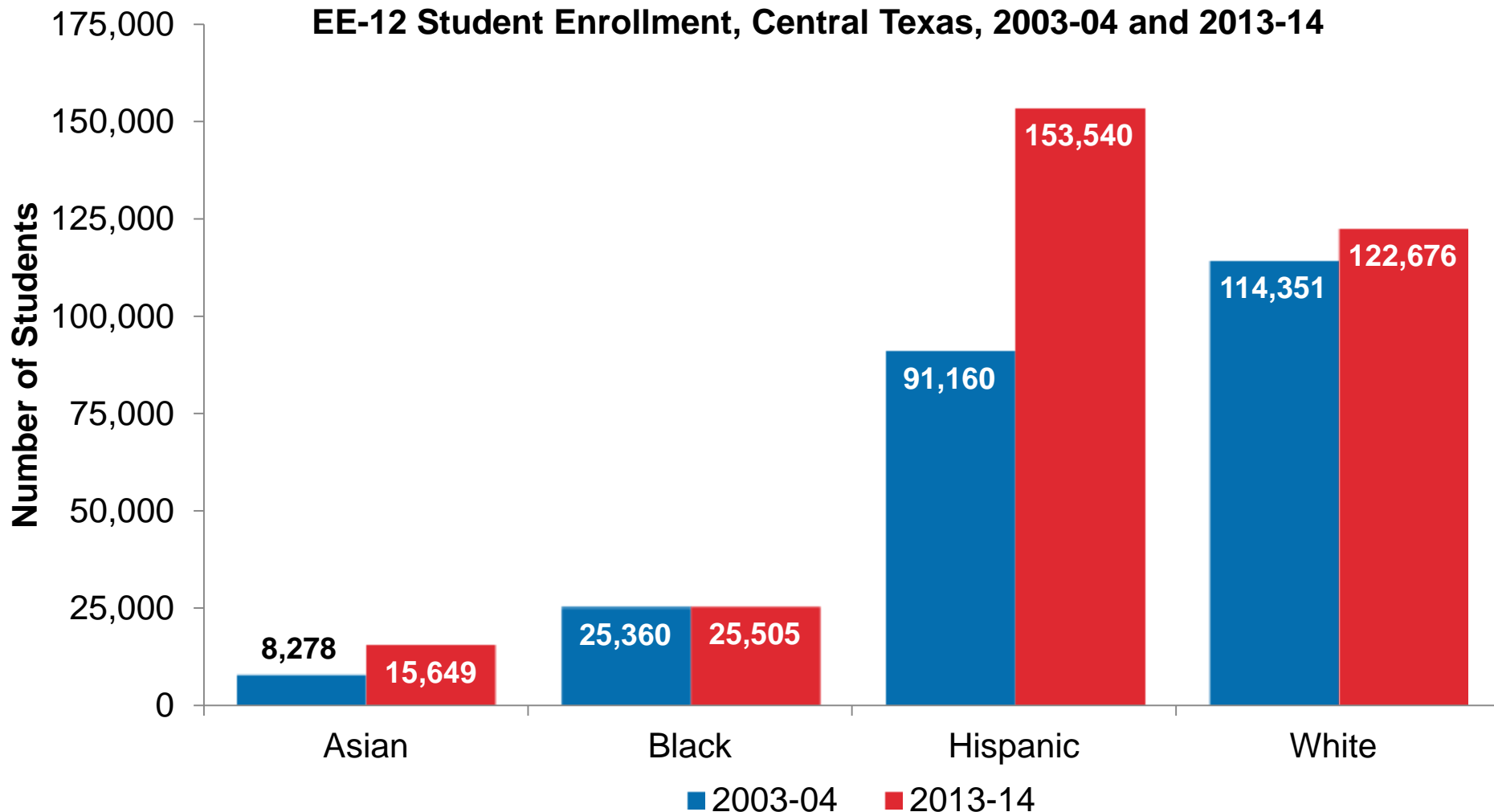
# Proportion of Students Previously Low Income Increases Across Grades

Percent of Students by Economic Status and Grade Level, Central Texas, 2013-14



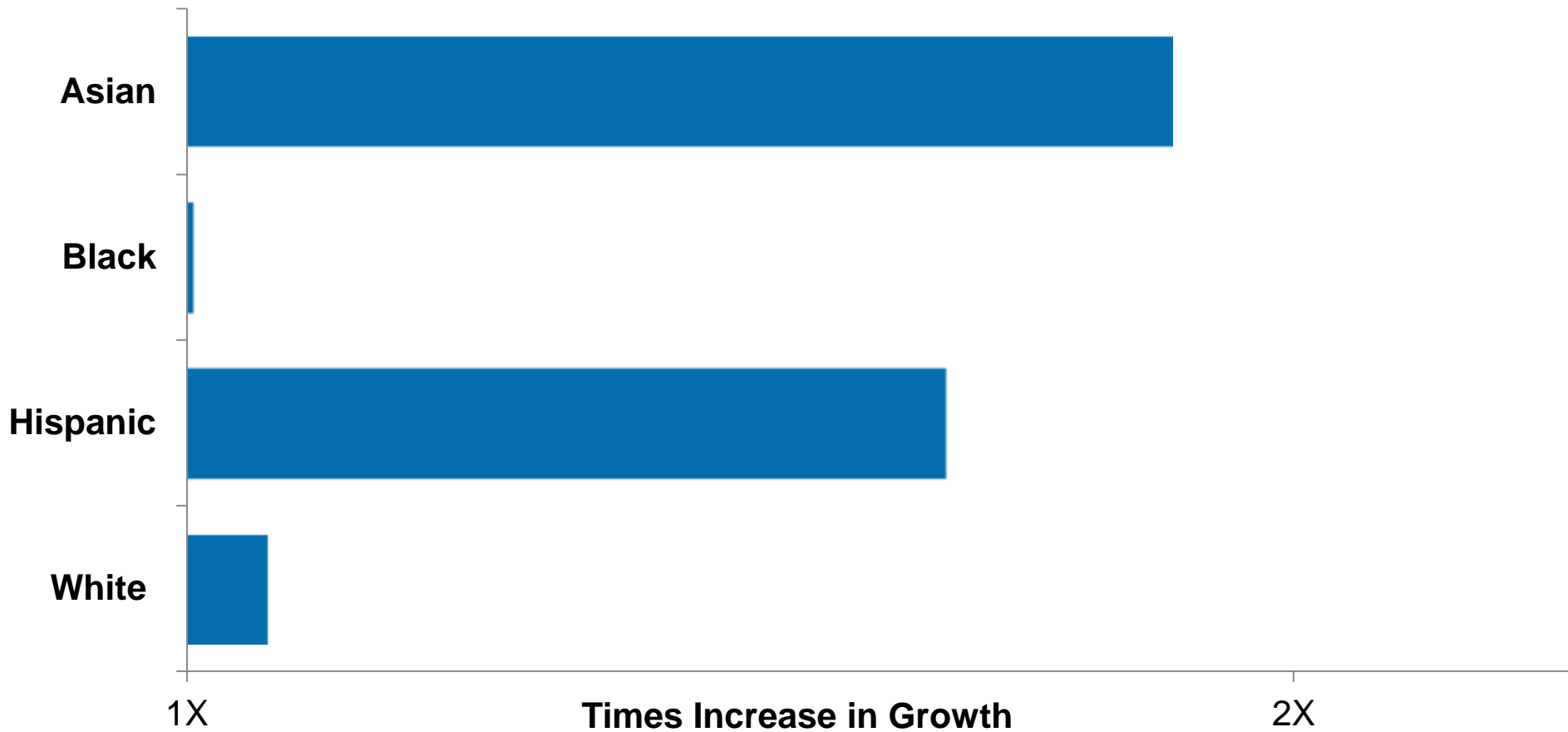
# Asian and Hispanic Student Populations Increased Dramatically Over Last Decade

EE-12 Student Enrollment, Central Texas, 2003-04 and 2013-14



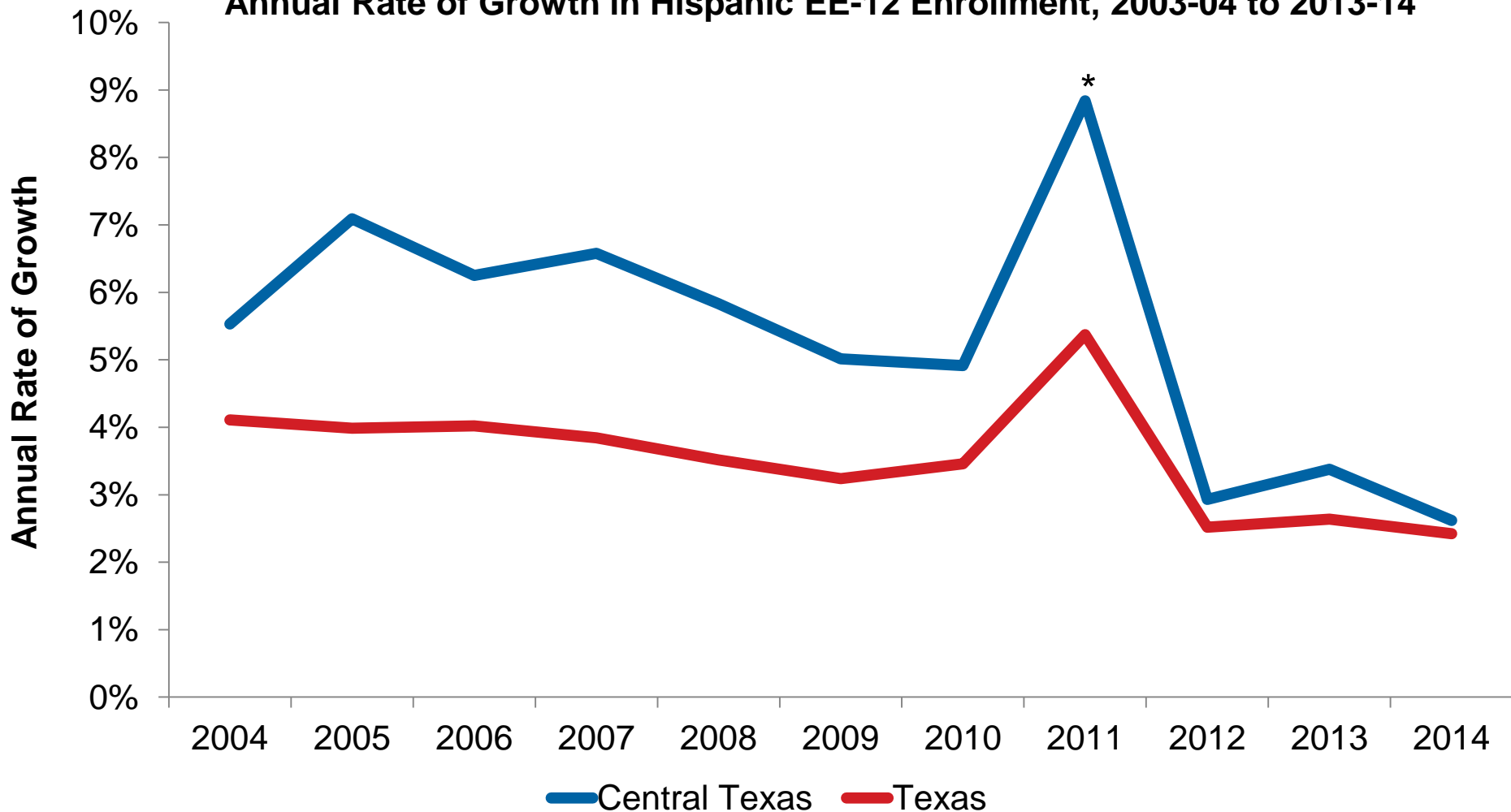
# Asian Population Nearly Doubled in Size Over Last Decade

# Rate of Growth In Hispanic Student Enrollment Has Generally Decreased Since 2005

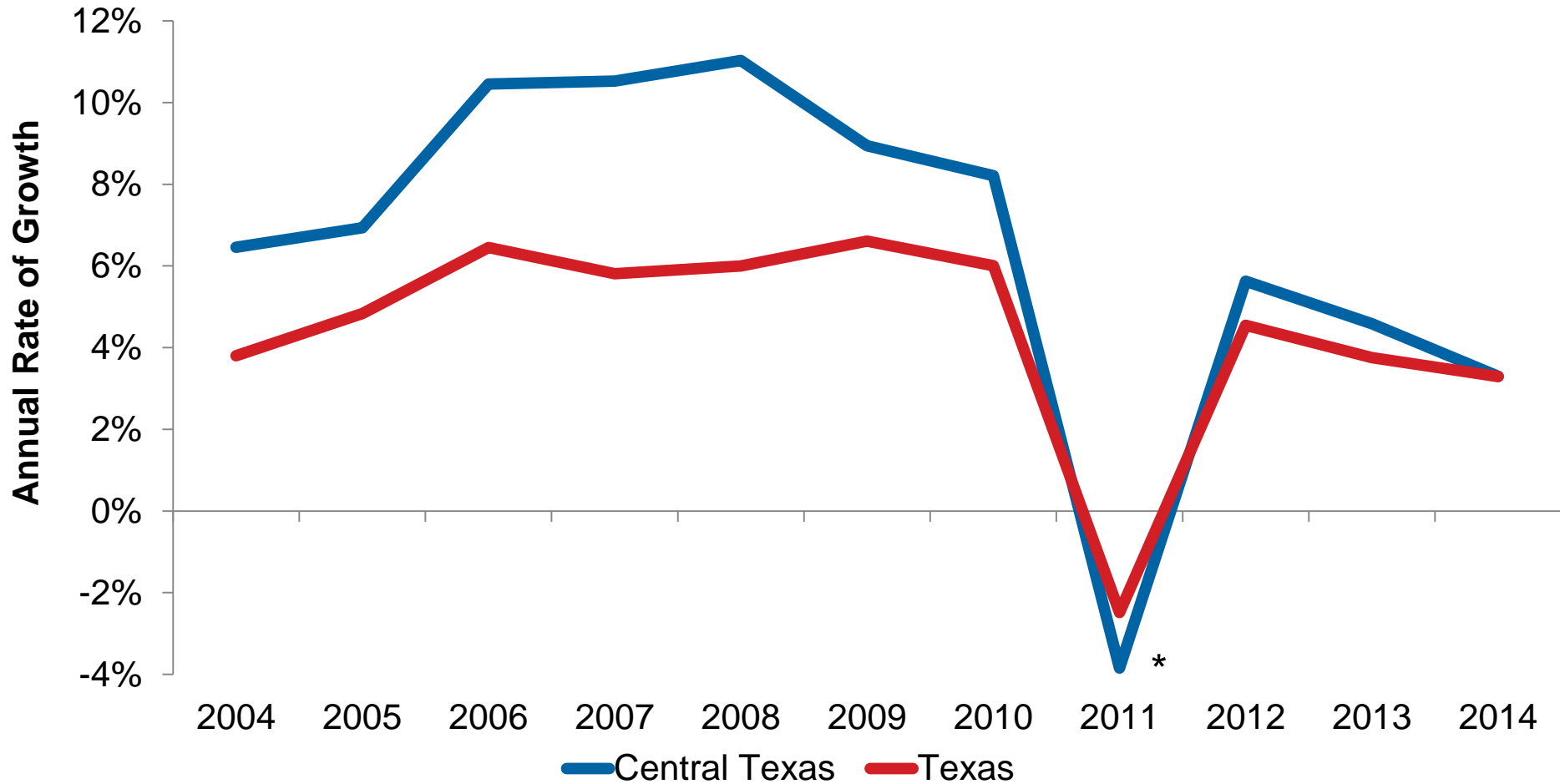
Annual Rate of Growth in Hispanic EE-12 Enrollment, 2003-04 to 2013-14





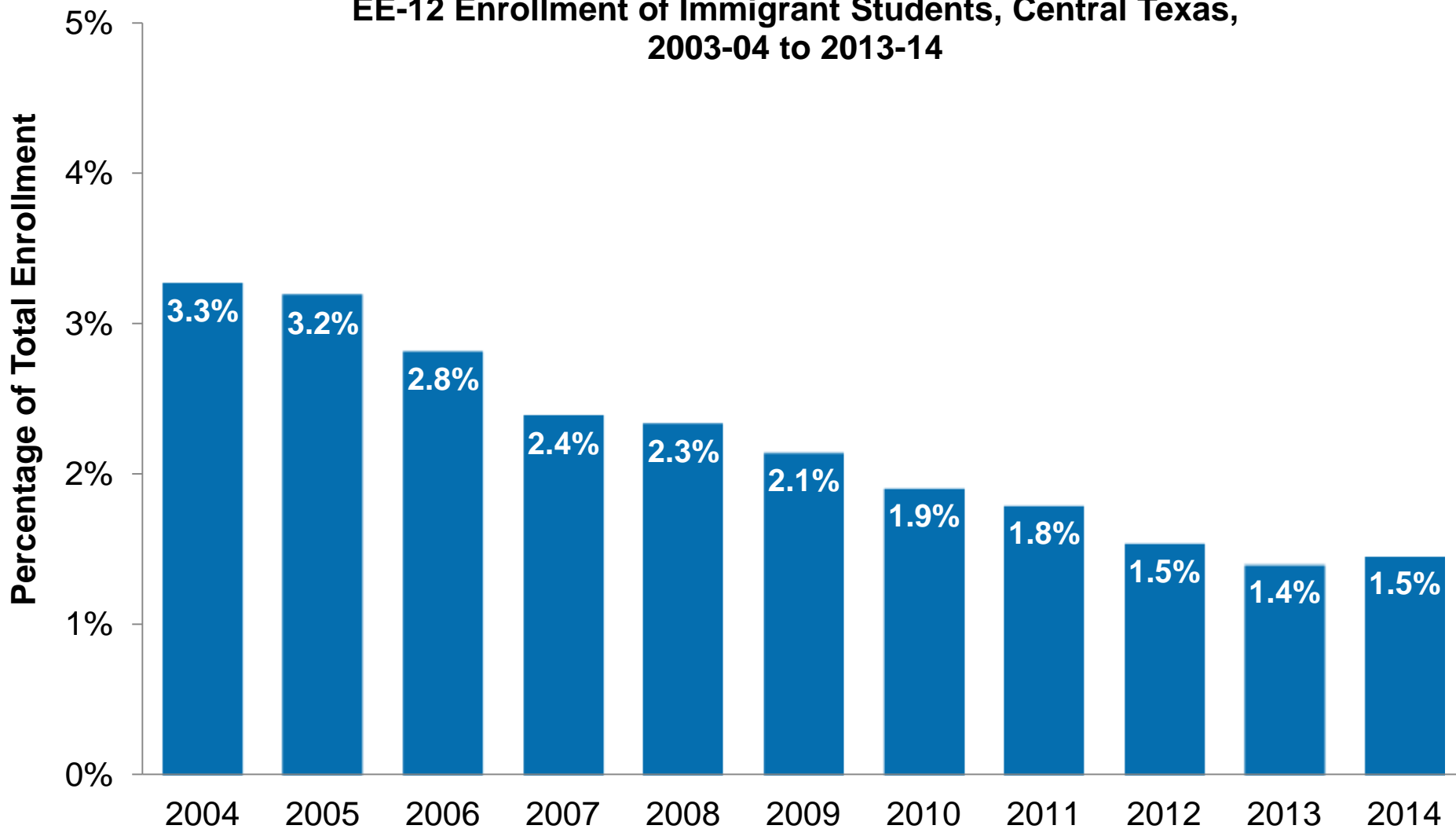
# Rate of Growth In Asian Student Enrollment Has Decreased Since 2008
