






It's a Structural Issue: Huge Increase in Disciplinary Actions Between 5th & 6th Grades

Disciplinary Actions Per Year, 03-08










Disciplinary Referral Rate – Mandatory Referrals 2013-2014




% Low Income Black and Hispanic Students (Male and Female)



Disciplinary Referral Rate – Discretionary Referrals 2013-2014









% Low Income Black and Hispanic Students (Male and Female)




Focus Metric: Percent of Students Passing 8th Grade STAAR reading exam

- ✓ Disproportional difference is the largest of all the metrics
- ✓ Literacy is required for success in all other academic areas
- ✓ Key "Student Success Indicator" outcome for students to proceed to higher grades



Reading STAAR Exam Passing Rate Grade 8, Spring 2015







All *RAISE^{up}* Schools - Pre- and Post-Test Outcomes vs. National Norms











2015 3D Growth in Reading, Hays CISD, Middle





Grade 8 Reading Test Passing Rate Bright Spots Analysis 2015



Possible Next Steps for Committee

- 1. Review landscape of efforts to build on
 - A. William Wayne Justice Center School-to-Prison Pipeline
 - B. RAISE^{up} Texas transforming middle school teaching and learning with focus on struggling readers
- Overlay qualitative data (the why?) to understand bright spots, plan for regional change in target metrics
- 3. Meet with partner districts to share analysis and build action plans to address improvements in target metrics school by school
- 4. Build regional action plan to move the needle on target metrics



Disproportional Difference Data Analysis: WHY?

- ➤ **Provide Focus**: use objective data analysis to identify those metrics that will make the biggest difference in closing gaps for young men of color
 - ✓ Choose range of metrics at each level of the education pipeline
 - ✓ Determine disproportional difference for all metrics
 - ✓ ID 2 focus metrics based on disproportional difference & other factors
- > Support Action: Provide comparative data sets to help institutions and our community move the needle on these metrics
 - ✓ What factor(s) most influence metric? (Gender/ethnicity/income)
 - ✓ Which schools are bright spots across the region?
 - ✓ Provide districts data to compare schools and focus actions
